## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO ENABLE RETIRED SCHOOL PRINCIPALS, ASSISTANT
PRINCIPALS, AND CENTRAL OFFICE ADMINISTRATIVE PERSONNEL TO
RETURN TO EMPLOYMENT WITH THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS WITHOUT
LOSING RETIREMENT BENEFITS.

6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

**SECTION 1.** G.S. 135-3(8)c. reads as rewritten:

Should a beneficiary who retired on an early or service 8 "c. retirement allowance under this Chapter be reemployed, or 9 otherwise engaged to perform services, by an employer 10 participating in the Retirement System on a part-time, 11 12 temporary, interim, or on a fee-for-service basis, whether contractual or otherwise, and if such beneficiary earns an 13 amount during the 12-month period immediately following the 14 effective date of retirement or in any calendar year which 15 exceeds fifty percent (50%) of the reported compensation, 16 excluding terminal payments, during the 12 months of service 17 preceding the effective date of retirement, or twenty thousand 18 dollars (\$20,000), whichever is greater, as hereinafter indexed, 19 then the retirement allowance shall be suspended as of the first 20 day of the month following the month in which the 21 reemployment earnings exceed the amount above, for the 22 balance of the calendar year. The retirement allowance of the 23 beneficiary shall be reinstated as of January 1 of each year 24 following suspension. The amount that may be earned before 25 suspension shall be increased on January 1 of each year by the 26 ratio of the Consumer Price Index to the Index one year earlier, 27 calculated to the nearest tenth of a percent (1/10 of 1%). 28

1	The computation of postretirement earnings of a beneficiary	
2	under this sub-subdivision, G.S. 135-3(8)c., who has been	
3	retired at least six months and has not been employed in any	
4	capacity, except as a substitute teacher or a part-time tutor,	
5	other substitute employee, with a public school for at least six	
6	months immediately preceding the effective date of	
7	reemployment, shall not include earnings while the beneficiary	
8	is employed to teach on a substitute, interim, or permanent basis	
9	in a public school. The Department of Public Instruction shall	
10	certify to the Retirement System that a beneficiary is employed	
11	to teach by a local school administrative unit under the	
12	provisions of this sub-subdivision and as a retired teacher or	
13	school administrative personnel as the term is defined under the	
14	provisions of G.S. $115C-325(a)(5a)$ .	
15	Beneficiaries employed under this sub-subdivision are not	
16	entitled to any benefits otherwise provided under this Chapter	
17	as a result of this period of employment."	
18	<b>SECTION 2.</b> G.S. 115C-325(a)(5a) reads as rewritten:	
19	"(5a) "Retired teacher or school administrative personnel" means a	
20	beneficiary of the Teachers' and State Employees' Retirement System	
21	of North Carolina who who:	
22	a. Was previously employed as a teacher, principal, assistant	
23	principal, or as central office administrative personnel,	
24	b. has <u>Has</u> been retired at least six months,	
25	<u>c.</u> has <u>Has</u> not been employed in any capacity, other than as a	
26	substitute teacher or a part-time tutor, teacher or other substitute	
27	employee, with a local board of education for at least six	
28	months, immediately preceding the effective date of	
29	reemployment,	
30	e. is <u>Is</u> determined by a local board of education to have had	
31	satisfactory performance during the last year of employment by	
32	a local board of education or a charter school, and	
33	<u>f.</u> who <u>Who</u> is employed to teach as provided in G.S. 135-3(8)c.	
34	A retired teacher shall be treated the same as a probationary teacher	
35	except that (i) a retired teacher is not eligible for career status and (ii)	
36	the performance of a retired teacher who had attained career status	
37	prior to retirement shall be evaluated in accordance with a local board	
38	of education's policies and procedures applicable to career teachers."	
39	SECTION 3. G.S. 115C-316(d) reads as rewritten:	
40	"(d) A local board of education may pay a retired teacher teachers and retired	
41	school administrative personnel, as that term is those terms are defined in	
42	G.S. 115C-325(a)(5a) no more than the employee employees would have received on	
43	the teacher appropriate salary schedule, excluding longevity, had the employee
