(b) For focused growth institutions and special needs inst appropriated to the trust shall be allocated by the Board as follows:

1	(1) On the basis of one five hundred thousand dollar (\$500,000) challenge
2	grant for each five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) raised from
3	private sources; or
4	(2) On the basis of one two hundred fifty thousand dollar (\$250,000)
5	challenge grant for each two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000)
6	raised from private sources.sources; or If an institution chooses to
7	pursue the use of the allocated challenge grant funds described in
8	either subdivision (1) or subdivision (2) of this subsection, the funds
9	shall be matched on a one-to-one basis.
10	(3) On the basis of one challenge grant of up to one million five hundred
11	thousand dollars (\$1,500,000) for funds raised from private sources in
12	the same amount as the challenge grant.
13	If an institution chooses to pursue the use of the allocated challenge grant funds
14	described in either subdivision (1), subdivision (2), or subdivision (3) of this subsection,
15	the challenge grant funds shall be matched by funds from private sources on the basis of
16	one dollar (\$1.00) of private funds for every one dollar (\$1.00) of State funds.
17	(c) Matching funds shall come from contributions made after July 1, 1985, and
18	pledged for the purposes specified by G.S. 116-41.14. Each participating constituent
19 20	institution's board of trustees shall establish its own Distinguished Professors
20 21	Endowment Trust Fund, and shall maintain it pursuant to the provision of G.S. 116-36 to function as a depository for private contributions and for the State matching funds for
21	the challenge grants. The State matching funds shall be transferred to the constituent
22	institution's Endowment Fund upon notification that the institution has received and
23 24	deposited the appropriate amount required by this section in its own Distinguished
25	Professors Endowment Trust Fund. Only the net income from that account shall be
<u>-</u> 26	expended in support of the distinguished professorship thereby created."

3	SECTION 3. G.S. 116-41.17 reads as rewritten:
4	"§ 116-41.17. Distinguished Professors Endowment Trust Fund; establishment of
5	chairs.
6	When the sum of the challenge grant and matching funds in the Scholars'
7	Distinguished Professors Endowment Trust Fund reaches:
8	(1) One million dollars (\$1,000,000), if the sum of funds described in
9	G.S. 116-41.15(1); or <u>116-41.15(a)(1) or G.S. 116-41.15(b)(1); or</u>
10	(2) Five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000), if the sum of funds
11	described in G.S. 116-41.15(2);116-41.15(a)(2) or
12	<u>G.S. 116-41.15(b)(2); or</u>
13	(3) An amount up to three million dollars (\$3,000,000), if the sum of
14	funds described in G.S. 116-41.15(a)(3) or G.S. 116-41.15(b)(3);
15	the board of trustees may recommend to the Board, for its approval, the establishment of
16	an endowed chair or chairs. The Board, in considering whether to approve the
17	recommendation, shall include in its consideration the programs already existing in The
18	University of North Carolina. If the Board approves the recommendation, the chair or
19	chairs shall be established. The chair or chairs, the property of the constituent
20	institution, may be named in honor of a donor, benefactor, or honoree of the institution,
21	at the option of the board of trustees."
22	SECTION 4. This act is effective when it becomes law.
