<b>SECTION 1.</b> Article 52 of Chapter 14 of the General Statute	s is amended by
adding a new section to read:	-
"§ 14-401.22. Concealment of death.	
(a) Any person who, with the intent to conceal the death of a	person, fails to
notify a law enforcement authority of the death or secretly buries or otl	herwise secretly
disposes of a dead human body is guilty of a Class I felony.	
(b) Any person who aids, counsels, or abets any other person in	concealing the
death of a person is guilty of a Class A1 misdemeanor."	
<b>SECTION 2.</b> This act becomes effective December 1, 2005	, and applies to
offenses committed on or after that date.
