5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	SECTION 1. Article 1 of the North Carolina Constitution is amended by
7	adding the following new section:
8	"Sec. 38. Restriction on use of eminent domain.
9	Neither the State of North Carolina nor any local government or political subdivision
10	may take any property by eminent domain where the purpose of the condemnation is for
11	economic development purposes, including increasing the tax base or increasing the rate
12	or quality of employment in a community."
13	SECTION 2. The amendment set out in Section 1 of this act shall be
14	submitted to the qualified voters of the State at the statewide general election to be held
15	November 7, 2006, which election shall be conducted under the laws then governing
16	elections in the State. Ballots, voting systems, or both may be used in accordance with
17	Chapter 163 of the General Statutes. The question to be used in the voting systems and
18	ballots shall be:
19	"[] FOR [] AGAINST
20	Constitutional amendment to prohibit the State of North Carolina or any local
21	government or political subdivision from taking any property by eminent domain where
22	the purpose of the condemnation is for economic development purposes, including
23	increasing the tax base or increasing the rate or quality of employment in a community."
24	SECTION 3. If a majority of votes cast on the question are in favor of the
25	amendment set out in Section 1 of this act, the State Board of Elections shall certify the
26	amendment to the Secretary of State. The Secretary of State shall enroll the amendment

- 1 so certified among the permanent records of that office. The amendment set out in
- 2 Section 1 of this act becomes effective January 1, 2007.
- 3 **SECTION 4.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
