A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO REBUILD THE FORT AT THE FORT
DOBBS STATE HISTORIC SITE.
Whereas, the year 2006 marks the 250 <sup>th</sup> anniversary of the construction of
Fort Dobbs; and
Whereas, Fort Dobbs was built in 1756 and served as a refuge for colonists
and an outpost for the military during the French and Indian War; and
Whereas, as the War came to an end and settlers moved westward, the fort
was dismantled; and

Whereas, in 1976, the area where the fort had been located became a State Historic Site; and

Whereas, plans have been made to rebuild the fort to enhance the historic site; and

Whereas, studies indicate that the reconstructed fort and the historic site will attract 100,000 visitors a year and will have an economic impact on Iredell County of \$25,000,000; and

Whereas, the 300-member Fort Dobbs Alliance has received tremendous support to rebuild the fort from the private and public sector as well as local and State leaders; and

Whereas, Fort Dobbs is an excellent resource for heritage tourism providing visitors with the opportunity to learn about the frontier life of Europeans, Native Americans, and African-Americans; and

Whereas, Fort Dobbs is an important Iredell County landmark and holds the distinction of being the only French and Indian War site in North Carolina; Now, therefore.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

**SECTION 1.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to Fort Dobbs Alliance, Inc., a nonprofit corporation, the sum of one hundred thousand dollars

- 1 (\$100,000) for the 2006-2007 fiscal year for architecture and design costs in
- 2 reconstructing the fort at the Fort Dobbs State Historic Site.
- 3 **SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2006.
