AN ACT TO DIRECT THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUM SERVICES, DIVISION OF MEDICAL ASSISTANCE, TO ESTABLISH A PIL PROGRAM TO EVALUATE THE USE OF TELEMONITORING EQUIPME FOR HOME AND COMMUNITY BASED RECIPIENTS, AND AN ACT EXCLUDE CERTAIN ADULT DAY CARE FACILITIES FRO REGISTRATION AND LICENSURE REQUIREMENTS. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: <b>SECTION 1.</b> The Department of Health and Human Services, Division Medical Assistance, shall implement a pilot program to evaluate the use telemonitoring equipment in home and community based services. As determined the Division, the Department shall provide remuneration to home care agencies other providers for participation in the pilot program. The pilot program shall implemented by October 1, 2006, and shall evaluate the use of telemonitor tequipment as a tool to improve the health of home and community based recipie through increased monitoring and responsiveness, and resulting in increas stabilization rates and decreased hospitalization rates. The evaluation must include representative number of older adults. The Department shall report to the St Commission on Aging by August 1, 2007.
