1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED			
2	AN ACT TO REDUCE FATALITIES AMONG NEW TEEN DRIVERS BY MAKING			
3	THE USE OF A MOBILE PHONE UNLAWFUL FOR A PERSON LESS THAN			
4	EIGHTEEN YEARS OF AGE AND WHO HOLDS A PROVISIONAL LICENSE			
5	WHILE DRIVING A MOTOR VEHICLE ON A PUBLIC STREET OR			
6	HIGHWAY OR PUBLIC VEHICULAR AREA, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE			
7	NC CHILD FATALITY TASK FORCE.			
8	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:			
9	SECTION 1. Chapter 20 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a			
10	new section to read:			
11	" <u>§ 20-137.3. Unlawful use of a mobile phone by persons under 18 years of age.</u>			
12	(a) <u>Definitions. – The following definitions apply in this section:</u>			
13	(1) Additional technology. – Any technology that provides access to			
14	digital media such as a camera, electronic mail, music, the Internet, or			
15	games.			
16	(2) Mobile telephone. – A device used by subscribers and other users of			
17	wireless telephone service to access the service. The term includes: (i)			
18	a device with which a user engages in a call using at least one hand,			
19	and (ii) a device that has an internal feature or function, or that is			
20	equipped with an attachment or addition, whether or not permanently			
21	part of the mobile telephone, by which a user engages in a call without			
22	the use of either hand, whether or not the use of either hand is			
23	necessary to activate, deactivate, or initiate a function of such			
24	telephone.			

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1	(3) Wireless telephone service. – A service that is a two-way real-time			
2	voice telecommunications service that is interconnected to a public			
3				
4	switched telephone network and is provided by a commercial mobile radio service, as such term is defined by 47 C.F.R. § 20.3.			
4 5	(b) Offense. – Except as otherwise provided in this section, no person under the			
6	age of 18 years shall operate a motor vehicle on a public street or highway or public			
7	vehicular area while using a mobile telephone or any additional technology associated			
8				
8 9	with a mobile telephone while the vehicle is in motion. This prohibition shall not apply to the use of a mobile telephone or additional technology in a stationary vehicle.			
10	(c) Seizure. – The provisions of this section shall not be construed as authorizing			
11	the seizure or forfeiture of a mobile telephone, unless otherwise provided by law.			
12	(d) Exceptions. – The provisions of subsection (b) of this section shall not apply			
12	if the use of a mobile telephone is for the sole purpose of communicating with:			
13	(1) Any of the following regarding an emergency situation: an emergency			
15	response operator; a hospital, physician's office, or health clinic; a			
16	public or privately owned ambulance company or service; a fire			
17	department; or a law enforcement agency.			
18	(2) The motor vehicle operator's parent, legal guardian or spouse.			
19	(e) Penalty. – Any person violating this section shall have committed an			
20	infraction and shall pay a fine of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00). This offense is an offense			
20	for which a defendant may waive the right to a hearing or trial and admit responsibility			
22	for the infraction pursuant to G.S. 7A-148. No drivers license points, insurance			
23	surcharge, or court costs shall be assessed as a result of a violation of this section."			
24	SECTION 2. G.S. 20-11(c) reads as rewritten:			
25	"(c) Level 1 Restrictions. – A limited learner's permit authorizes the permit holder			
26	to drive a specified type or class of motor vehicle only under the following conditions:			
27	(1) The permit holder must be in possession of the permit.			
28	(2) A supervising driver must be seated beside the permit holder in the			
29	front seat of the vehicle when it is in motion. No person other than the			
30	supervising driver can be in the front seat.			
31	(3) For the first six months after issuance, the permit holder may drive			
32	only between the hours of 5:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m.			
33	(4) After the first six months after issuance, the permit holder may drive at			
34	any time.			
35	(5) Every person occupying the vehicle being driven by the permit holder			
36	must have a safety belt properly fastened about his or her body, or be			
37	restrained by a child passenger restraint system as provided in			
38	G.S. 20-137.1(a), when the vehicle is in motion.			
39	(6) The permit holder shall not use a mobile telephone or other additional			
40	technology associated with a mobile telephone while operating the			
41	motor vehicle on a public street or highway or public vehicular area."

14			a specified type or class of motor vehicle only under the following

16		(1)	The license holder shall be in possession of the license.
17		(2)	The license holder may drive without supervision in any of the
18			following circumstances:
19			a. From 5:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m.
20			b. When driving to or from work.
21			c. When driving to or from an activity of a volunteer fire
22			department, volunteer rescue squad, or volunteer emergency
23			medical service, if the driver is a member of the organization.
24		(3)	The license holder may drive with supervision at any time. When the
25			license holder is driving with supervision, the supervising driver shall
26			be seated beside the license holder in the front seat of the vehicle when
27			it is in motion. The supervising driver need not be the only other
28			occupant of the front seat, but shall be the person seated next to the
29			license holder.
30		(4)	When the license holder is driving the vehicle and is not accompanied
31			by the supervising driver, there may be no more than one passenger
32			under 21 years of age in the vehicle. This limit does not apply to
33			passengers who are members of the license holder's immediate family
34			or whose primary residence is the same household as the license
35			holder. However, if a family member or member of the same
36			household as the license holder who is younger than 21 years of age is
37			a passenger in the vehicle, no other passengers under 21 years of age,
38			who are not members of the license holder's immediate family or
