## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2 AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO ASSIST IN DEVELOPING THE 21<sup>ST</sup> 3 CENTURY FARMERS' MARKETS PROGRAM, A PILOT PROGRAM TO 4 ASSIST SMALL, LOW-INCOME NORTH CAROLINA FARMERS WHO MARKET THEIR PRODUCTS DIRECTLY TO CUSTOMERS TO ENROLL IN 5 THE USDA FOOD AND NUTRITION SERVICE FOOD STAMP PROGRAM, TO 6 7 EDUCATE AND ENCOURAGE THESE FARMERS TO ACCEPT NONCASH 8 CUSTOMER PAYMENTS, AND TO PROVIDE EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS 9 TO FOOD STAMP RECIPIENTS; THEREBY HELPING THESE FARMERS 10 INCREASE THEIR CUSTOMER BASE WHILE EDUCATING LOW-INCOME 11 PERSONS ABOUT THE BENEFITS OF HEALTHY DIETS AND IMPROVED 12 NUTRITION. 13 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

**SECTION 1.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to The Leaflight, 14 15 Inc., the sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for the 2006-2007 fiscal year to assist in the development of and the operational and staffing costs of its 21<sup>st</sup> Century Farmers' 16 Markets Program, a pilot program to assist small, low-income North Carolina farmers 17 who market their products directly to customers to enroll in the Food Stamp Program of 18 19 the United States Department of Agriculture, Food and Nutrition Service, to educate and encourage these farmers to accept noncash customer payments, and to provide 20 educational materials to food stamp recipients; thereby helping these farmers increase 21 22 their customer base while educating low-income persons about the benefits of having a healthy diet and improved nutrition. 23
