1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE NORTH CAROLINA STATE BOARD OF DENTAL
3	EXAMINERS TO ACCEPT, IN ADDITION TO EXAMINATIONS
4	CONDUCTED BY THE BOARD, THE RESULTS OF OTHER
5	BOARD-APPROVED REGIONAL OR NATIONAL INDEPENDENT
6	THIRD-PARTY CLINICAL EXAMINATIONS OF APPLICANTS SEEKING A
7	LICENSE TO PRACTICE AS A DENTAL HYGIENIST, AND AUTHORIZING
8	THE BOARD TO CHARGE THE ACTUAL COST OF THE THIRD-PARTY
9	TESTING SERVICE, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE JOINT LEGISLATIVE
10	ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURE OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE.
11	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
12	SECTION 1. G.S. 90-223(a) reads as rewritten:
13	"(a) The Board is authorized and empowered to:
14	(1) Conduct examinations for licensure,
15	(2) Issue licenses and provisional licenses,
16	(3) Issue annual renewal certificates, and
17	(4) Renew expired licenses. licenses, and
18	(5) Contract with a regional or national testing agency to conduct clinical
19	examinations. Prior to entering a contract with a regional or national
20	testing agency, the Board shall evaluate the agency based on the
21	following criteria:
22	a. The number of states that recognize the results of the testing
23	agency's examination.
24	b. The cost to the applicant of the examination.
25	c. How long the testing agency has been conducting examinations.d. Whether the examination includes procedures performed on
26	
27	human subjects as part of the assessment of clinical
28	competencies."
29	SECTION 2. G.S. 90-224 reads as rewritten:

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1	"§ 90-224. Examination.
2	(a) The applicant for licensure must be of good moral character, have graduated
3	from an accredited high school or hold a high school equivalency certificate duly issued
4	by a governmental agency or unit authorized to issue the same, and be a graduate of a
5	program of dental hygiene in a school or college approved by the Board.
6	(b) The Board shall have the authority to establish in its rules and regulations:
7	(1) The form of application;
8	(2) The time and place of examination;
9	(3) The type of examination;
10	(4) The qualifications for passing the examination.
11	(b1) The Board also may grant a license to an applicant who is found to have
12	passed an examination given by a Board-approved regional or national dental hygiene
13	testing agency, provided that the Board deems the regional or national examination to
14	be substantially equivalent to or an improvement upon the examination given by the
15	Board, and the applicant meets the other qualifications set forth in this Article.
16	(c) The Department of Justice may provide a criminal record check to the Board
17	for a person who has applied for a new or renewal license through the Board. The Board
18	shall provide to the Department of Justice, along with the request, the fingerprints of the
19	applicant, any additional information required by the Department of Justice, and a form
20	signed by the applicant consenting to the check of the criminal record and to the use of
21	the fingerprints and other identifying information required by the State or national
22	repositories. The applicant's fingerprints shall be forwarded to the State Bureau of
23	Investigation for a search of the State's criminal history record file, and the State Bureau
24	of Investigation shall forward a set of the fingerprints to the Federal Bureau of
25	Investigation for a national criminal history check. The Board shall keep all information
26	pursuant to this subsection privileged, in accordance with applicable State law and
27	federal guidelines, and the information shall be confidential and shall not be a public
28	record under Chapter 132 of the General Statutes.
29	The Department of Justice may charge each applicant a fee for conducting the
30	checks of criminal history records authorized by this subsection."
31	SECTION 3. G.S. 90-232 reads as rewritten:
32	"§ 90-232. Fees.
33	(a) In order to provide the means of carrying out and enforcing the provisions of
34	this Article and the duties devolving upon the North Carolina State Board of Dental
35	Examiners, it is authorized to charge and collect fees established by its rules not
36	exceeding the following:
37	(1) Each applicant for examination\$350.00
38	(2) Each renewal certificate, which fee shall be annually
39 40	fixed by the Board and not later than November 30 of each
40	year it shall give written notice of the amount of the renewal
41	fee to each dental hygienist licensed to practice in this State
42	by mailing such notice to the last address of record with the Board of each such dental hygionist
43	(2) Each restoration of license 150.00
44	(3) Each restoration of license150.00

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1	(4) Each provisional license
2	(5) Each certificate of license to a resident dental hygienist
3	desiring to change to another state or territory
4	(6) Annual fee to be paid upon license renewal to assist in
5	funding programs for impaired dental hygienists
6	(7) Each license by credentials1,500.
7	(b) In all instances where the Board uses the services of a regional or national
8	testing agency for preparation, administration, or grading of examinations, the Board
9	may require applicants to pay the actual cost of the testing agency in lieu of the fee
10	authorized in subdivision (a)(1) of this section.
11	(c) In no event may the annual fee imposed on dental hygienists to fund the
12	impaired dental hygienists program exceed the annual fee imposed on dentists to fund
13	the impaired dentist program. All fees shall be payable in advance to the Board and
14	shall be disposed of by the Board in the discharge of its duties under this Article."
15	SECTION 4. The North Carolina State Board of Dental Examiners shall
16	continue to conduct clinical examinations for applicants seeking a license to practice
17	dental hygiene until at least September 30, 2007. No applicant for a dental hygiene
18	license shall be required to take a Board-approved regional or national independent
19	third-party clinical examination prior to September 30, 2007.
20	SECTION 5. Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary, the North
21	Carolina State Board of Dental Examiners may accept any application for the dental
22	hygiene clinical examination to be conducted on June 8, 2006, if the application was
23	received on or before March 31, 2006.
24	SECTION 6. This act becomes effective July 1, 2006.
