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2	AN ACT TO AMEND THE POWERS OF THE NORTH CAROLINA TURNPIKE					
3	AUTHORITY.					
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:					
5	SECT	FION 1. G.S. 136-89.183 reads as rewritten:				
6	"§ 136-89.183.	Powers of the Authority.				
7		Authority shall have all of the powers necessary to execute the provisions				
8	8 of this Article, including the following:					
9	(1)	The powers of a corporate body, including the power to sue and be				
10		sued, to make contracts, to adopt and use a common seal, and to alter				
11		the adopted seal as needed.				
12	(2)	To study, plan, develop, and undertake preliminary design work on up				
13		to six Turnpike Projects. At the conclusion of these activities, the				
14		Turnpike Authority is authorized to To study, plan, develop, design,				
15		establish, purchase, construct, operate, and maintain three-up to six				
16		Turnpike Projects. Projects, either on its own initiative or at the request				
17		of the Board of Transportation. One of the Turnpike Projects shall be				
18		located in whole or in part in a county with a population equal to or				
19		greater than 650,000 persons, according to the latest decennial census,				
20		and one Turnpike Project shall be located in a county or counties that				
21		each have a population of fewer that 650,000 persons, according to the				
22		latest decennial census. A Turnpike Project selected for construction				
23		by the Turnpike Authority shall be included in any applicable locally				
24		adopted comprehensive transportation plans and shall be shown in the				
25		current State Transportation Improvement Plan prior to the letting of a				
26		contract for the Turnpike Project.				
27	(3)	To study, plan, develop and undertake preliminary design work on				
28		three Turnpike Projects, in addition to the three turnpike projects				
29		described in subdivision (2) of this subsection, either on its own				

1		initiative or at the request of the Board of Transportation. The
2		Authority shall take no further action on a project described by this
3		subdivision unless authorized to do so by Statute.
4	(4)	To rent, lease, purchase, acquire, own, encumber, dispose of, or
5		mortgage real or personal property, including the power to acquire
6		property by eminent domain pursuant to G.S. 136-89.184.
7	(5)	To fix, revise, charge, and collect tolls and fees for the use of the
8		Turnpike Projects. Prior to the effective date of any toll or fee for use
9		of a Turnpike Facility, the Authority shall submit a description of the
10		proposed toll or fee to the Board of Transportation, the Joint
11		Legislative Transportation Oversight Committee and the Joint
12		Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations for review.
13	(6)	To issue bonds or notes of the Authority as provided in this Article.
14	(7)	To establish, construct, purchase, maintain, equip, and operate any
15		structure or facilities associated with the Turnpike System.
16	(8)	To pay all necessary costs and expenses in the formation, organization,
17		administration, and operation of the Authority.
18	(9)	To apply for, accept, and administer loans and grants of money or real
19		or personal property from any federal agency, the State or its political
20		subdivisions, local governments, or any other public or private sources
21		available.
22	(10)	To adopt, alter, or repeal its own bylaws or rules implementing the
23		provisions of this Article, in accordance with the review and comment
24		requirements of G.S. 136-89.182(j).
25	(11)	To utilize employees of the Department; to contract for the services of
26		consulting engineers, architects, attorneys, real estate counselors,
27		appraisers, and other consultants; to employ administrative staff as
28		may be required in the judgment of the Authority; and to fix and pay
29		fees or compensation to the Department, contractors, and
30		administrative employees from funds available to the Authority.
31	(12)	To receive and use appropriations from the State and federal
32		government.
33	(13)	To adopt procedures to govern its procurement of services and
34		delivery of Turnpike Projects.
35	(14)	To perform or procure any portion of services required by the
36		Authority.
37	(15)	To use officers, employees, agents, and facilities of the Department for
38		the purposes and upon the terms as may be mutually agreeable.
39	(16)	To contract for the construction, maintenance, and operation of a
40		Turnpike Project.
41	(17)	To enter into partnership agreements, agreements with political
42		subdivisions of the State, and agreements with private entities, and to
43		expend such funds as it deems necessary, pursuant to such agreements,

for the purpose of financing the cost of acquiring, constructing, 1 2 equipping, operating, or maintaining any Turnpike Project. 3 To execute the powers provided in subsection (a) of this section, the (b) 4 Authority shall determine its policies by majority vote of the members of the Authority Board present and voting, a quorum having been established. Once a policy is 5 6 established, the Authority Board shall communicate it to the Executive Director or the Executive Director's designee, who shall have the sole and exclusive authority to 7 execute the policy of the Authority. No member of the Authority Board shall have the 8 9 responsibility or authority to give operational directives to any employee of the 10 Authority other than the Executive Director or the Director's designee.
