<b>SECTION 3.</b> The amendments set out in this act shall be submitted to the	
qualified voters of the State at the next statewide election, primary or otherwise, which	
election shall be conducted under the laws then governing elections in the State.	
Ballots, voting systems, or both may be used in accordance with Chapter 163 of the	
General Statutes. The question to be used in the voting systems and ballots shall be:
