2	AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE CONSTRUCTION AND THE FINANCING,
3	WITHOUT APPROPRIATIONS FROM THE GENERAL FUND, OF CERTAIN
4	CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS PROJECTS OF THE CONSTITUENT
5	INSTITUTIONS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA.
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	SECTION 1. The purpose of this act is: (i) to authorize the construction or
8	acquisition by certain constituent institutions of The University of North Carolina of the
9	capital improvements projects listed in the act for the respective institutions, and (ii) to
10	authorize the financing of these projects with funds available to the institutions from
11	gifts, grants, receipts, self-liquidating indebtedness, Medicare reimbursements for
12	education costs, or other funds, or any combination of these funds, but not including
13	funds received for tuition or appropriated from the General Fund.
14	SECTION 2. The capital improvements projects, and their respective costs,
15	authorized by this act to be constructed or otherwise acquired and financed as provided
16	in Section 1 of this act, including by revenue bonds, by special obligation bonds as
17	authorized in Section 5 of this act, or by both, are as follows:

40	SECTION 3. The following capital improvements projects are authorized by
41	the Board of Governors as supplements to previously approved projects, and their
42	respective costs are authorized by this act to be constructed and financed as provided in
43	Section 1 of this act, including by revenue bonds, by special obligation bonds as
44	authorized in Section 5 of this act, or by both:

30	SECTION 4. At the request of the Board of Governors of The University of
31	North Carolina and upon determining that it is in the best interest of the State to do so,
32 33	the Director of the Budget may authorize an increase or decrease in the cost of, or a change in the method of funding the prejects authorized by this set. In determining
33 34	change in the method of, funding the projects authorized by this act. In determining whether to authorize a change in cost or funding, the Director of the Budget may consult
34 35	with the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations.
35 36	SECTION 5. Pursuant to G.S. 116D-26, the Board of Governors may issue,
30 37	subject to the approval of the Director of the Budget, at one time or from time to time,
38	special obligation bonds of the Board of Governors for the purpose of paying all or any
39	part of the cost of acquiring, constructing, or providing for the projects authorized by
40	Sections 2 and 3 of this act. The maximum principal amount of bonds to be issued shall
41	not exceed the specified project costs in Sections 2 and 3 of this act plus five percent
42	(5%) of such amount to pay issuance expenses, fund reserve funds, pay capitalized
43	interest, and pay other related additional costs, plus any increase in the specific project
44	costs authorized by the Director of the Budget pursuant to Section 4 of this act.

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1 **SECTION 6.** With respect to The University of North Carolina at Chapel 2 Hill's Research Resources Facility capital project, the institution may accomplish 3 construction and financing notwithstanding the requirement in G.S. 116D-22(5) as to 4 location at the institution.

5 **SECTION 7.** With respect to the forty-seven million five hundred twenty-6 two thousand dollars (\$47,522,000) Major Infrastructure Improvements capital project 7 at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill that was previously approved in S.L. 8 2005-324, the institution may accomplish a portion thereof by payment to Duke Power 9 Company LLC to acquire distribution capacity in improvements to be constructed by 10 Duke Power Company LLC to three electrical substations located on the institution's property and by negotiating and executing any rights-of-way, easements, leases, and any 11 12 other required agreements with Duke Power Company LLC necessary for the 13 completion of the improvements, notwithstanding any other provisions of the General 14 Statutes governing such negotiation and execution of such rights-of-way, easements, 15 leases, or other required agreements therefor.

16 **SECTION 8.** With respect to the thirty million dollars (\$30,000,000) 17 Student Housing project at North Carolina Central University that was previously 18 approved in S.L. 2005-324, the institution may construct one or more new or purchase 19 one or more existing buildings to meet its need for student housing.

SECTION 9. This act is effective when it becomes law.

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
