4	OF ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLES BY PERSONS EIGHT TO FIFTEEN YEARS
5	OLD BASED ON ENGINE CAPACITY, TO PROHIBIT SELLERS FROM
6	KNOWINGLY SELLING ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLES FOR USE BY PERSONS
7	LESS THAN EIGHT YEARS OLD OR FOR USE BY PERSONS EIGHT TO
8	FIFTEEN YEARS OLD IN VIOLATION OF THE ENGINE CAPACITY
9	LIMITATIONS, TO REQUIRE SAFETY TRAINING FOR ATV OPERATORS,
10	AND TO CREATE INFRACTIONS FOR VIOLATIONS.

21	b. Grams of alcohol per 210 liters of breath.
22	The results of a defendant's alcohol concentration determined by a
23	chemical analysis of the defendant's breath or blood shall be reported
24	to the hundredths. Any result between hundredths shall be reported to
25	the next lower hundredth.
