AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE CERTAIN LICENSED FACILITIES OR PROVIDERS							

MEDICATION ADMINISTRATION.
The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. Article 16 of Chapter 131E of the General Statutes is amended by adding the following new section to read:

"§ 131E-270. Use of unlicensed health care personnel to perform technical aspects of medication administration.

- (a) Facilities licensed and medication administration services provided under Articles 5, 6, and 10 of this Chapter may utilize unlicensed health care personnel to perform the technical aspects of medication administration consistent with G.S. 90-171.20(7) and (8), and G.S. 90-171.43.
- (b) The Commission shall adopt rules to implement this section. Rules adopted by the Commission shall include:
 - (1) Training and competency evaluation of medication aides as provided for under this section.
 - (2) Requirements for listing under the Medication Aide Registry as provided for under G.S. 131E-271.
 - Requirements for supervision of medication aides by licensed health professionals or appropriately qualified supervisory personnel consistent with Articles 5, 6, 10, and 16 of this Chapter."
