A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 2 AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE NORTH CAROLINA STATE BOARD OF DENTAL 3 EXAMINERS TO ACCEPT. IN ADDITION TO **EXAMINATIONS** BY RESULTS 4 CONDUCTED THE BOARD, THE OF OTHER 5 BOARD-APPROVED REGIONAL OR NATIONAL INDEPENDENT THIRD-PARTY CLINICAL EXAMINATIONS OF APPLICANTS SEEKING A LICENSE 6 7 TO PRACTICE DENTISTRY: AND AUTHORIZING THE BOARD TO 8 ACQUIRE REAL PROPERTY. 9 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: **SECTION 1.** G.S. 90-30(a) reads as rewritten: 10 The North Carolina State Board of Dental Examiners shall grant licenses to 11 "(a) practice dentistry to such applicants who are graduates of a reputable dental institution, 12 who, in the opinion of a majority of the Board, shall undergo a satisfactory examination 13 14 of proficiency in the knowledge and practice of dentistry, subject, however, to the further provisions of this section and of the provisions of this Article. 15 The applicant for a license to practice dentistry shall be of good moral character, at 16 least 18 years of age at the time the application for examination is filed. The application 17 for a dental license shall be made to the said-Board in writing and shall be accompanied 18 by evidence satisfactory to said the Board that the applicant is a person of good moral 19 character, has an academic education, the standard of which shall be determined by the 20 said-Board; that he the applicant is a graduate of and has a diploma from a reputable 21 22 dental college or the dental department of a reputable university or college recognized, accredited and approved as such by the said Board.Board; and that the applicant has 23 passed a clinical licensing examination, the standard of which shall be determined by 24 the Board. 25 The North Carolina State Board of Dental Examiners is authorized to conduct both 26 written or oral and clinical examinations or to accept the results of other 27

Board-approved regional or national independent third-party clinical examinations that 1 2 include procedures performed on human subjects as part of the assessment of restorative 3 clinical competencies and that are determined by the Board to be of such character as to 4 thoroughly test the qualifications of the applicant, and may refuse to grant <u>a license</u> to 5 any person who, in its discretion, is found deficient in said examination, or the 6 examination. The Board may refuse to grant a license to any person guilty of cheating. 7 deception or fraud during such the examination, or whose examination discloses to the 8 satisfaction of the Board, a deficiency in academic or clinical education. The Board may 9 employ such all dentists found qualified therefor by the Board, in examining applicants 10 for licenses as it deems appropriate. The North Carolina State Board of Dental Examiners may refuse to grant a license to 11 12 any person guilty of a crime involving moral turpitude, or gross immorality, or to any person addicted to the use of alcoholic liquors or narcotic drugs to such an extent as, in 13 14 the opinion of the Board, renders the applicant unfit to practice dentistry. 15 Any license obtained through fraud or by any false representation shall be void ab initio and of no effect." 16 17 **SECTION 2.** G.S. 90-39(1) reads as rewritten: 18 "§ 90-39. Fees. 19 In order to provide the means of carrying out and enforcing the provisions of this 20 Article and the duties devolving upon the North Carolina State Board of Dental 21 Examiners, it is authorized to charge and collect fees established by its rules not 22 exceeding the following: 23 (1)Each application for general dentistry examination license......\$1,200 Ì..." 24 25 **SECTION 3.** G.S. 90-28 reads as rewritten: 26 "§ 90-28. Bylaws and regulations.regulations; acquisition of property. 27 The North Carolina State Board of Dental Examiners shall have the power to (a) make necessary bylaws and regulations, not inconsistent with the provisions of this 28 29 Article, regarding any matter referred to in this Article and for the purpose of 30 facilitating the transaction of business by the said-Board. 31 The Board shall have the power to acquire, hold, rent, encumber, alienate, (b) 32 and otherwise deal with real property in the same manner as a private person or 33 corporation, subject only to approval of the Governor and the Council of State. Collateral pledged by the Board for an encumbrance is limited to the assets, income, and 34 35 revenues of the Board." **SECTION 4.** This act is effective when it becomes law. 36
