	ECTION 1. Article 8 of Chapter 143 of the General Statutes is amended by

Force within the Department of Administration. The Task Force shall consist of 15	
members as follows:	
<u>(1</u>)	One member appointed by the North Carolina League of
	Municipalities.
<u>(2</u>)	One member appointed by the North Carolina Association of County
	Commissioners.
<u>(3</u>)	One member appointed by the North Carolina School Boards
	Association.
<u>(4</u>)	One member appointed by the North Carolina Institute for Minority
	Economic Development.
<u>(5)</u>	Three members appointed by the North Carolina Minority and
	Women's Business Enterprise Coordinator's Network.
<u>(6</u>)	Eight members appointed by the Office of Historically Underutilized
	Business, two of whom shall be representatives of the Office, one of
	whom shall be a minority business owner, one of whom shall be a
	female business owner, one of whom shall be a disabled business
	owner, and three of whom shall be public members.
(b) Th	ne Task Force shall propose uniform criteria and procedures for: (i) the

certification of businesses under G.S. 143-48 and G.S. 143-128.2 as Historically

Underutilized Businesses; (ii) the creation and maintenance of a database of the

businesses certified; and (iii) any other matters related to the certification of businesses

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- as authorized in this section. The Task Force may seek assistance, including technical, business, or managerial, to ensure the reliability of the proposed certification criteria and procedures. In determining ownership of a business for purposes of certification, the Task Force shall use the definitions provided in G.S. 143-48 and G.S. 143-128.2.
 - (c) The Task Force shall meet as often as necessary for the conduct of business, but shall meet no less than once every quarter. A quorum shall consist of one-third of the total membership, and all action shall be taken by a majority vote. Vacancies on the Task Force shall be filled by the agency that made the original appointment.
 - (d) The Secretary of Administration shall approve the criteria and procedures proposed by the Task Force.
 - **SECTION 2.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
