### A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO ENHANCE THE INFRASTRUCTURE THAT SUPPORTS OYSTER
RESTORATION ACTIVITIES, TO PROTECT AND RESTORE WATER
QUALITY AND HABITAT IN PRIME OYSTER GROWING AREAS, AND TO
APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO HELP SUPPORT PROJECTS TO REHABILITATE
OYSTER HABITATS AND SANCTUARIES.

7 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

8 **SECTION 1.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the 9 Department of Environment and Natural Resources the sum of two hundred thousand 10 dollars (\$200,000) for the 2005-2006 fiscal year and the sum of two hundred thousand 11 dollars (\$200,000) for the 2006-2007 fiscal year to be allocated to the Division of 12 Marine Fisheries for the Shellfish Rehabilitation Program. The funds appropriated 13 under this section shall be used to plant an additional 160,000 bushels of cultch material 14 annually, i.e., oyster shell, clamshell or marl.

15 **SECTION 2.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the 16 Department of Environment and Natural Resources the sum of two hundred thousand 17 dollars (\$200,000) for the 2005-2006 fiscal year and the sum of two hundred thousand 18 dollars (\$200,000) for the 2006-2007 fiscal year to be allocated to the Division of 19 Marine Fisheries to create two oyster sanctuaries per year.

SECTION 3. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Environment and Natural Resources the sum of eighty thousand dollars (\$80,000) for the 2005-2006 fiscal year and the sum of eighty thousand dollars (\$80,000) for the 2006-2007 fiscal year to be allocated as follows:

- (1) Of the funds appropriated by this section, the sum of forty-five
  thousand dollars (\$45,000) shall be used each fiscal year to support a
  position for an oyster shell recycling coordinator.
- 27 (2) Of the funds appropriated by this section, the sum of thirty-five
   28 thousand dollars (\$35,000) shall be used each fiscal year to provide
   29 recycling infrastructure.

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1		<b>SECTION 4.</b> Article 21 of Chapter 143 of the General Statutes is amended
2		a new section to read:
3		4.7A. Prohibit new or expanded stormwater discharge into prime
4		<u>shellfish waters.</u>
5	<u>(a)</u>	Definitions. – The following definitions apply in this section:
6		(1) "Stormwater collection system" means any conduit including, but not
7		limited to, pipes, ditches, swales, drains, canals, gutters, curbs, or
8		impervious surfaces such as roads.
9		(2) "Prime shellfish growing area" includes any shellfish growing area in
10		which all or part of the shellfish growing area is classified as
11		Outstanding Resource Waters by the North Carolina Division of Water
12		Quality. The term also includes, but is not limited to, shellfish growing
13		areas A-2, A-3, B-1, B-7, B-9, C-1, C-2, C-3, D-3, E-4, E-6, F-1, F-2,
14		F-5, F-7, G-3, G-4, and G-7 as delineated by the North Carolina
15		Division of Environmental Health. Additional growing areas may be
16		determined to be prime oyster growing areas through a proclamation
17		by the Director of the Division of Marine Fisheries.
18	<u>(b)</u>	Notwithstanding any other provision of law, no new or expanded discharge of
19	stormwate	r shall be permitted through any stormwater collection system that drains to a
20	prime she	llfish growing area or unnamed freshwater tributaries to a prime shellfish
21	growing a	rea, except in the case of a storm exceeding the 10-year/24-hour storm."
22		SECTION 5. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the
23	Departmen	nt of Environment and Natural Resources the sum of two hundred thirty-seven
24	thousand a	dollars (\$237,000) for the 2005-2006 fiscal year and the sum of two hundred
25	thirty-seve	en thousand dollars (\$237,000) for the 2006-2007 fiscal year to be allocated to
26	the Divisio	on of Environmental Health as follows:
27		(1) Of the funds appropriated by this section, the sum of sixty-nine
28		thousand dollars (\$69,000) shall be used each fiscal year to support a
29		position for a GIS staff person.
30		(2) Of the funds appropriated by this section, the sum of one hundred
31		sixty-eight thousand dollars (\$168,000) shall be used each fiscal year
32		to support three positions for shoreline surveyors to expand the pilot
33		program that examines the sources of pollution that affect shellfish
34		growing areas to all shellfish growing areas in the coastal region.
35		<b>SECTION 6.</b> Under the State Revolving Fund (SRF), Congress provides the
36	states with	grant funds to establish revolving loan programs to assist in the funding of
37	wastewate	r treatment facilities and projects associated with estuary and nonpoint source
38	programs.	In order to receive funding from the SRF, projects must be included on a
39	priority fu	
40	-	Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the installation of stormwater
41		hall be an equal priority with water and sewer projects under the State
42		Fund (SRF) and any other grants or loans established under State bond
43		through the North Carolina Rural Economic Development Center or other
44	-	stormwater retrofits that remove outfalls from Class SA waters shall be given

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- 1 the highest priority in the SRF rating system, subject to approval by the Environmental
- 2 Protection Agency. As an incentive, State Revolving Fund loans that are made to
- 3 eligible entities to install stormwater retrofits that remove outfalls from shellfish
- 4 receiving waters shall also be provided interest free.
- 5 **SECTION 7.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2005.
