4	SECT	TION 1. G.S. 115C-84.2 reads as rewritten:
5	"§ 115C-84.2. §	School calendar.
6	(a) Schoo	ol Calendar Each local board of education shall adopt a school
7		ing of 215 days all of which shall fall within the fiscal year. A school
8	calendar shall in	clude the following:
9	(1)	A minimum of 180 days and 1,000 hours of instruction covering at
10		least nine calendar months. The local board shall designate when the
11		180 instructional days shall occur. The number of instructional hours
12		in an instructional day may vary according to local board policy and
13		does not have to be uniform among the schools in the administrative
14		unit. Local boards may approve school improvement plans that include
15		days with varying amounts of instructional time. If school is closed
16		early due to inclement weather, the day and the scheduled amount of
17		instructional hours may count towards the required minimum to the
18		extent allowed by State Board policy. The school calendar shall
19		include a plan for making up days and instructional hours missed when
20		schools are not opened due to inclement weather.

22	(2)	A minimum of 10 annual vacation leave days.
23	(3)	The same or an equivalent number of legal holidays occurring within
24		the school calendar as those designated by the State Personnel
25		Commission for State employees.
26	(4)	Five days, as designated by the local board, for use as teacher
27		workdays. These days shall be protected to allow teachers to complete

1		instructional and classroom administrative duties. The local school
2		administrative unit shall not impose any additional tasks on these days.
3		The local board shall schedule one of these days at the beginning of
4		the school year and one at the end of each academic quarter.
5	(5)	The remaining days scheduled by the local board in consultation with
6		each school's principal for use as teacher workdays, additional
7		instructional days, or other lawful purposes. Before consulting with the
8		local board, each principal shall work with the school improvement
9		team to determine the days to be scheduled and the purposes for which
10		they should be scheduled. Days may be scheduled and planned for
11		different purposes for different personnel and there is no requirement
12		to schedule the same dates for all personnel. In order to make up days
13		for school closing because of inclement weather, the local board may
14		designate any of the days in this subdivision as additional make-up
15		days to be scheduled after the last day of student attendance.

34		the request of the local board of education or of the principal of a
35		school, a teacher may elect to work on one of the 42 days when teacher
36		attendance is not required in lieu of another scheduled workday.
37	(3)	School shall not be held on Sundays.
38	(4)	Veterans Day shall be a holiday for all public school personnel and for

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Opening and Closing Dates. - Local boards of education shall determine the 1 (d)2 dates of opening and closing the public schools under subdivision (a)(1) of this section. 3 Except for year-round schools, the opening date for students shall not be before August 4 25. August 18, and the closing date for students shall not be after June 10.10. If, 5 however, August 18 falls on Friday, the opening date shall not be before the preceding 6 Thursday; if August 18 falls on Saturday or Sunday, the opening date shall not be before 7 the following Monday. 8 On a showing of good cause, the State Board of Education may waive this 9 requirement opening and closing dates set forth in this subsection to the extent that 10 school calendars are able to provide sufficient days to accommodate anticipated makeup 11 days due to school-closings, closings, but in no event shall a waiver be granted 12 authorizing a school to open before August 10. A local board may revise the scheduled 13 closing date if necessary in order to comply with the minimum requirements for 14 instructional days or instructional time. For purposes of this subsection, the term "good 15 cause" means that schools in any local school administrative unit in a county have been closed eight days per year during any four of the last 10 years because of severe weather 16 17 conditions, energy shortages, power failures, or other emergency situations. 18 The State Board also may waive this requirement the opening and closing dates set 19 forth in this subsection for an educational purpose, purpose, but in no event shall a 20 waiver be granted authorizing a school to open before August 10. The term "educational 21 purpose" means a local school administrative unit establishes a need to adopt a different 22 calendar for (i) for a specific school to accommodate a special program offered 23 generally to the student body of that school, (ii) for a school that primarily serves a 24 special population of students, or (iii) for a defined program within a school. school, (iv) 25 on a systemwide basis to align the calendar with that of a community college or 26 university in the geographic area; (v) on a systemwide basis to adjust the examination 27 schedule to benefit students or to accommodate Advanced Placement and International

- 28 Baccalaureate examinations; (vi) on a systemwide basis to accommodate 29 implementation of block schedules; or (vii) on a systemwide basis due to inclement 30 weather or other emergency situations. The State Board may grant the waiver for an 31 educational purpose for that specific school or defined program or on a systemwide 32 basis to the extent that the State Board finds that the educational purpose is reasonable, 33 the accommodation is necessary to accomplish the educational purpose, and the request 34 is not an attempt to circumvent the opening and closing dates set forth in this 35 subsection. The waiver requests for educational purposes shall not be used to 36 accommodate system wide class scheduling mere preferences.
- The required opening and closing dates under this subsection shall not apply to any school that a local board designated as having a modified calendar for the 2003-2004 school year or to any school that was part of a planned program in the 2003-2004 school year for a system of modified calendar schools, so long as the school operates under a modified calendar.
- 42 (e) Nothing in this section prohibits a local board of education from offering
 43 supplemental or additional educational programs or activities outside the calendar

1	SECTION 2. G.S. 115D-20 is amended by adding a new subdivision to
2	read:
3	"§ 115D-20. Powers and duties of trustees.
4	The trustees of each institution shall constitute the local administrative board of such
5	institution, with such powers and duties as are provided in this Chapter and as are
6	delegated to it by the State Board of Community Colleges. The powers and duties of
7	trustees shall include the following:
8	
9	(14) To the extent permitted by law and by rules adopted by the State Board
10	of Community Colleges, to align its calendar for curriculum courses
11	with the calendars of the local school administrative units located in its
12	service area."
13	SECTION 3. G.S. 116-235(a1) reads as rewritten:
14	"(a1) Academic Program. –
15	(1) The Board of Trustees shall establish the standard course of study for
16	the School. This course of study shall set forth the subjects to be taught
17	in each grade and the texts and other educational materials on each
18	subject to be used in each grade.
19	(2) The Board of Trustees shall adopt regulations governing class size, the
20	instructional calendar, the length of the instructional day, and the
21	number of instructional days in each term. To the extent permitted by
22	law and by rules adopted by the Board of Governors, the Board of
23	Trustees shall align its instructional calendar with the calendars of the
24	local school administrative unit located in its county and in contiguous
25	counties."
26	SECTION 4. This act becomes effective July 1, 2007, and applies beginning
27	with the 2007-2008 school year.
