3	OF COLLECTING CIVIL FINES UNDER SOME CIRCUMSTANCES.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	SECTION 1. G.S. 115C-457.2 reads as rewritten:
6	"§ 115C-457.2. Remittance of moneys to the Fund.
7	(a) The clear proceeds of all civil penalties, civil forfeitures, and civil fines that
8	are collected by a State agency and that the General Assembly is authorized to place in a
9	State fund pursuant to Article IX, Section 7(b) of the Constitution shall be remitted to
10	the Office of State Budget and Management by the officer having custody of the funds
11	within 10 days after the close of the calendar month in which the revenues were
12	received or collected. Notwithstanding any other law, all such funds shall be deposited
13	in the Civil Penalty and Forfeiture Fund. The clear proceeds of these funds include the
14	full amount of all civil penalties, civil forfeitures, and civil fines collected under
15	authority conferred by the State, diminished only by the actual costs of collection, not to
16	collection.
17	Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, the costs of collection shall not
18	exceed twenty percent (20%) of the amount collected. The collection cost percentage to
19	be used by a State agency shall be established and approved by the Office of State
20	Budget and Management on an annual basis based upon the computation of actual
21	collection costs by each agency for the prior fiscal year.
22	(b) If an agency demonstrates to the Office of State Budget and Management
23	that, due to extraordinary circumstances, the actual costs of collection for the agency is
24	higher than twenty percent (20%) of the amount collected, the Office of State Budget
25	and Management may permit the agency to retain its actual costs of collection."
26	SECTION 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 2007, and applies to funds
27	received or collected on or after that date.
