- 2 AN ACT TO PROHIBIT TOUGHMAN MATCHES IN NORTH CAROLINA.
- 3 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. G.S. 143-653 reads as rewritten:

5 "§ 143-653. Ultimate warrior warrior and toughman matches prohibited.

6 Ultimate <u>warrior</u> warrior and toughman matches, whether the participants are 7 professionals or amateurs, are prohibited. No person shall promote, conduct, or engage 8 in ultimate warrior <u>matches.matches</u>. No person shall promote, conduct, or engage in 9 <u>toughman matches</u>. This section shall not preclude boxing and kickboxing as regulated 10 in this Article or professional wrestling."

SECTION 2. G.S. 143-652.1 reads as rewritten:

12 "§ **143-652.1. Regulation of Boxing.**

13 The Alcohol Law Enforcement Division of the Department of Crime Control and 14 Public Safety shall regulate live boxing and kickboxing matches, whether professional, 15 amateur, sanctioned amateur, or toughman events, in which admission is charged for 16 viewing, or the contestants compete for a purse or prize of value greater than 17 twenty-five dollars (\$25.00). The Division shall have the exclusive authority to approve and issue rules for the regulation of the conduct, promotion, and performances of live 18 19 boxing, kickboxing, sanctioned amateur, amateur, and amateur, and toughman matches and exhibitions in this State. The rules shall be issued pursuant to the provisions of 20 21 Chapter 150B of the General Statutes and may include, without limitation, the following subjects: 22

23 24 (1) Requirements for issuance of licenses and permits required by this Article.

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- (2) Regulation of ticket sales.
- 26 (3) Physical requirements for contestants, including classification by weight and skill.
- 28 (4) Supervision of matches and exhibitions by licensed physicians and referees.

1	(5)	Insurance and bonding requirements.
2	(6)	Compensation of participants and licensees.
3	(7)	Contracts and financial arrangements.
4	(8)	Prohibition of dishonest, unethical, and injurious practices.
5	(9)	Facilities.
6	(10)	Approval of sanctioning amateur sports organizations.
7	(11)	Procedures and requirements for compliance with the Professional
8		Boxing Safety Act of 1996."
9	SEC	FION 3. This act is effective when it becomes law.
