The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
SECTION 1. G.S. 20-135.2B reads as rewritten:		
"§ 20-135.2B. Transporting children under 12-16 years of age in open bed or open		
cargo area of a vehicle prohibited; exceptions.

	compliance with Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard	
	installed to support a load strength of not less than 5,000 pc	ounds for
	each belt, and of a type approved by the Commissioner.	
(3)	An emergency situation exists.	
(4)	The vehicle is being operated in a parade pursuant to a valid p	ermit.
(5)	The vehicle is being operated in an agricultural enterprise.	

- (6) The vehicle is being operated in a county that has no incorporated area with a population in excess of 3,500.
- (c) Any person violating this section shall have committed an infraction and shall pay a penalty of <u>not more than</u> twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).(\$25.00), even if more than one child less than 16 years of age is riding in the open bed or open cargo area of a <u>vehicle</u>. Conviction of an infraction under this section has no consequence other than payment of a penalty. A person found responsible for a violation of this section <u>may not shall</u> be assessed court costs. A person violating this section shall be assessed two drivers license points by the Division.
- (d) No drivers license points or insurance surcharge shall be assessed on account of violation of this section. A violation of this section shall not constitute negligence per se."
- **SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective October 1, 2008, and applies to offenses committed on or after that date.
