2	AN ACT TO PROMOTE ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE BY REQUIRING
3	APPLICANTS, AS PART OF THE PERMITTING PROCESS FOR NEW SOLID
4	WASTE LANDFILLS AND EXPANSIONS OF EXISTING SOLID WASTE
5	LANDFILLS, TO PREPARE AN ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT STATEMENT
6	AND TO CONDUCT A SEPARATE REVIEW OF COMMUNITY IMPACTS
7	THAT RELIES IN PART ON A DEMOGRAPHIC STUDY BY THE APPLICANT
8	FOR THE AREA LOCATED WITHIN FIVE MILES OF ANY BOUNDARY OF
9	THE SITE OF THE PROPOSED LANDFILL.
10	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
11	SECTION 1. Part 2 of Article 9 of Chapter 130A of the General Statutes is
12	amended by adding a new section to read:
13	" <u>§ 130A-294.2. Additional requirements for siting a solid waste landfill.</u>
14	(a) As part of the permitting process under G.S. 130A-294, every applicant for a
15	new solid waste landfill or to expand an existing landfill under G.S. 130A-294 shall
16	conduct a review of environmental impacts by preparing an environmental impact
17	statement under Article 1 of Chapter 113A of the General Statutes and shall conduct a
18	comprehensive review of community impacts that relies in part on the information
19	obtained from the demographic study conducted by the applicant under subsection (b)
20	of this section. Each review under this subsection shall include an analysis of
21	alternatives. The draft environmental impact statement and the draft of the review of
22	community impacts shall be sent to the Department of Environment and Natural
23	Resources, the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations, the
24	Governor, and the Office of Environmental Justice. A copy of the final statement and
25	review under this subsection shall be available to the public upon request.
26	(b) Prior to submitting a permit to the Department for a new solid waste landfill
27	or to expand an existing landfill under G.S. 130A-294, each applicant shall conduct a

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1	demographic st	udy for the area that is located within five miles of any boundary of the			
2	site of the proposed landfill. This demographic study shall be based on the smallest				
3	tracts available from the United States Census Bureau and, for those tracts not available				
4	from the United States Census Bureau, on door-to-door surveys. This study shall				
5		e following information:			
6	(1)	The age, gender, race, ethnic background, financial status, and any			
7	<u> </u>	chronic illness of each resident in this area.			
8	<u>(2)</u>	An examination of the adequacy of housing located in this area and a			
9	<u> </u>	determination of whether the residences in this area are on well water.			
10	<u>(3)</u>	The potential costs for extending drinking water from a new or			
11		existing water supply system to each residence on well water in this			
12		<u>area.</u>			
13	<u>(4)</u>	Transportation routes for trucks and vehicles into and from the			
14		proposed site for the landfill.			
15	<u>(5)</u>	School bus routes and traffic analysis showing vehicle miles for each			
16		road located in this area.			
17	<u>(6)</u>	The availability of adequate health care for the residents of this area.			
18	<u>(7)</u>	A description and the location of each school, day care center, nursing			
19		home, prison, church, and cemetery located in this area.			
20	<u>(8)</u>	A description of each facility located in this area that requires any			
21		State or local permit, including facility location, facility number,			
22		permit number for each permit, permitted discharge limits, and any			
23		toxic release inventory.			
24	<u>(9)</u>	Any other matters that examine the impact of the proposed solid waste			
25		facility on the surrounding community, as required by the Division of			
26		Waste Management of the Department of Environment and Natural			
27		Resources.

10	SECTION 2	• G.S. 130A-294(a)(4)a. reads as rewritten:
11	"(4) a.	Develop a permit system governing the establishment and
12		operation of solid waste management facilities. A landfill with a
13		disposal area of 1/2 acre or less for the on-site disposal of land
14		clearing and inert debris is exempt from the permit requirement
15		of this section and shall be governed by G.S. 130A-301.1. The
16		Department shall not approve an application for a new permit,
17		the renewal of a permit, or a substantial amendment to a permit
18		for a sanitary landfill, excluding demolition landfills as defined
19		in the rules of the Commission, except as provided in
20		subdivisions (3) and (4) of subsection (b1) of this section. No
21		permit shall be granted for a solid waste management facility
22		having discharges that are point sources until the Department
23		has referred the complete plans and specifications to the
24		Environmental Management Commission and has received
25		advice in writing that the plans and specifications are approved
26		in accordance with the provisions of G.S. 143-215.1. If the
27 28		applicant is a unit of local government, and has not submitted a
28 29		solid waste management plan that has been approved by the Department pursuant to $C = 120A - 200 = 00A(b)$ the Department
29 30		Department pursuant to G.S. 130A-309.09A(b), the Department
30 31		may deny a permit for a sanitary landfill or a facility that disposes of solid waste by incineration, unless the Commission
32		has not adopted rules pursuant to G.S. 130A-309.29 for local
33		solid waste management plans. In any case where the
34		Department denies a permit for a solid waste management
35		facility, it shall state in writing the reason for denial and shall
36		also state its estimate of the changes in the applicant's proposed
37		activities or plans that will be required for the applicant to
38		obtain a permit.
39	b.	The issuance of permits for sanitary solid waste landfills
40		operated by local governments is exempt from is, under
41		<u>G.S. 130A-294.2</u> , subject to the environmental impact
42		statements required by Article 1 of Chapter 113A of the
43		General Statutes, entitled the North Carolina Environmental
44		Policy Act of 1971. All-However; all sanitary landfill permits

1	issued to local governments prior to July 1, 1984, are hereby
2	validated notwithstanding any failure to provide environmental
3	impact statements pursuant to the North Carolina
4	Environmental Policy Act of 1971;".
5	SECTION 3. This act becomes effective January 1, 2008, and applies to
6	applications for permits for new solid waste landfills and permits to expand existing

7 solid waste landfills that are filed on or after that date.
