21		Board during the course of an investigation conducted by the Board.

23		indicates the person is unfit or incompetent to practice pedorthics as

25		defrauded, or endangered the public.

27		with his or her ability to provide appropriate care as established by this
28		Article or rules adopted by the Board.

1	(a) Any person who violates any provision of this Article shall be guilty of a
2	Class 1 misdemeanor and may be subject to a civil penalty of not more than one
3	thousand dollars (\$1,000) for each violation of this Article.
4	(b) The Board may apply to the superior court for an order enjoining violations
5	of this Article, and upon a showing by the Board that any person has violated or is about
6	to violate this Article, the court may grant an injunction or restraining order or take
7	other appropriate action."
8	SECTION 2. Any person who submits proof to the Board that the person
9	has been actively engaged in business as a pedorthist in this State for at least three
10	consecutive years before the effective date of this act and pays the required fee for the
11	issuance of a license shall be licensed without having to satisfy the requirements of
12	G.S. 90-202.26, enacted by Section 1 of this act. All persons who do not make
13	application to the Board within one year of the effective date of this act shall be required
14	to complete all requirements prescribed by the Board and to otherwise comply with the
15	provisions of G.S. 90-202.26.
16	<b>SECTION 3.</b> Notwithstanding G.S. 90-202.24(a)(1) and (2), as enacted by
17	Section 1 of this act, the initial pedorthists appointed to the North Carolina Pedorthist
18	Licensure Board do not have to meet the licensure qualifications established under
19	G.S. 90-202.26, as enacted by Section 1 of this act. The appointees must be pedorthists
20	certified by the Board for Certification in Pedorthics and must apply for and obtain a
21	license from the Board within 90 days after the Board begins issuing licenses.
22	<b>SECTION 4.</b> This act is effective when it becomes law.
