## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO AMEND THE DISTRIBUTION OF THE PROCEEDS OF THE SCRAP
3	TIRE DISPOSAL TAX TO INCREASE FUNDS ALLOCATED TO COUNTIES
4	FOR THE DISPOSAL OF SCRAP TIRES, TO INCREASE FUNDS ALLOCATED
5	TO THE SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT TRUST FUND, AND TO DECREASE
6	FUNDS ALLOCATED TO THE SCRAP TIRE DISPOSAL ACCOUNT.
7	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
8	SECTION 1. G.S. 105-187.19 reads as rewritten:
9	"§ 105-187.19. Use of tax proceeds.
10	(a) The Secretary shall distribute the taxes collected under this Article, less the
11	allowance to the Department of Revenue for administrative expenses, in accordance
12	with this section. The Secretary may retain the cost of collection by the Department, not
13	to exceed two hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$225,000) a year, as
14	reimbursement to the Department.
15	(b) Each quarter, the Secretary shall credit five percent (5%) eight percent (8%)
16	of the net tax proceeds to the Solid Waste Management Trust Fund and shall credit
17	twenty seven percent (27%)twenty-two percent (22%) of the net tax proceeds to the
18	Scrap Tire Disposal Account. The Secretary shall distribute the remaining sixty-eight
19	percent (68%) seventy percent (70%) of the net tax proceeds among the counties on a
20	per capita basis according to the most recent annual population estimates certified to the
21	Secretary by the State Budget Officer.
22	(c) A county may use funds distributed to it under this section only as provided
23	in G.S. 130A-309.54. A county that receives funds under this section and that has an
24	agreement with another unit of local government under which the other unit of local
25	government provides for the disposal of solid waste for the county shall transfer the
26	amount received under this section to the other unit of local government. A unit of local
27	government to which funds are transferred is subject to the same restrictions on use of
28	the funds as the county."
29	<b>SECTION 2.</b> This act becomes effective 1 July 2007.

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
