A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO DIRECT THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA TO STUDY THE ACCESSIBILITY OF ITS FACILITIES TO SEVERELY PHYSICALLY DISABLED INDIVIDUALS SEEKING BASIC ACCESS TO HIGHER EDUCATION WITHIN THE STATE UNIVERSITY SYSTEM.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. The Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina shall study the accessibility of its facilities to severely physically disabled individuals seeking basic access to higher education at constituent institutions within the State University System. In its study, the Board of Governors may consider all of the following:

- What specific educational assistance the State has funded that would (1) be available to severely physically disabled individuals.
- What specific educational assistance the State currently funds that (2) would be available to severely physically disabled individuals.
- The role of the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation of the (3) Department of Health and Human Services in providing educational assistance at public and private universities or secondary schools that was, or currently is, available to severely physically disabled individuals.
- **(4)** Whether the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation of the Department of Health and Human Services could provide for the personal care of severely physically disabled students at one or more constituent institutions within the State University System.
- The desirability and feasibility of making the facilities of one (5) constituent institution accessible to severely physically disabled students.

SECTION 2. No later than May 1, 2008, the Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina shall submit a report of its study to the Fiscal Research Division and to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee, including its findings, recommendations, and any legislative proposals.

SECTION 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 2007.
