6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
7	SECTION 1. G.S. 115C-12(23) reads as rewritten:

9	The general supervision and administration of the free public school system shall be		
10	vested in the State Board of Education. The State Board of Education shall establish		
11	policy for the system of free public schools, subject to laws enacted by the General		
12	Assembly. The powers and duties of the State Board of Education are defined as		
13	follows:

15	(23) Power <u>and Duty to Adopt Eligibility Rules for Interscholastic Athletic</u>		
16	Competition The State Board of Education may adopt rules		
17	governing interscholastic athletic activities conducted by local boards		
18	of education, including eligibility for student participation. The State		
19	Board of Education may authorize a designated organization to apply		
20	and enforce the Board's rules governing participation in interscholastic		
21	athletic activities at the high school level.		
22	Prior to the 2007-2008 school year, the State Board of Education		
23	shall adopt rules that (i) prohibit the use of performance enhancing		
24	drugs, including anabolic steroids, by students participating in		
25	interscholastic athletic activities, (ii) require random testing for these		
26	drugs of students who participate in interscholastic athletic activities,		
27	and (iii) ban participation in interscholastic athletic activities by		
28	students who refuse to be tested or test positive for prohibited drugs."		
29	SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.
