1 2 3 4	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO AMEND THE LAW REGARDING THE BENEFITS PAID TO STUDENTS ATTENDING STATE EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS ON SCHOLARSHIPS FOR CHILDREN OF WAR VETERANS.		
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
6	SECTION 1. G.S. 165-21(a) reads as rewritten:		
7	"(a) A scholarship granted pursuant to this Article shall consist of the following		
8	benefits in either a State or private educational institution:		
9	(1) With respect to State educational institutions, unless expressly limited		
10	elsewhere in this Article, a scholarship shall consist of:		
11 12	a. Tuition, b. A reasonable board allowance, allowance at a college,		
12	b. A reasonable board allowance, allowance at a college, <u>university, or university-owned facility</u> ,		
13 14	c. A reasonable room allowance, allowance at a college,		
15	university, or university-owned facility.		
16	d. Matriculation and other institutional fees required to be paid as		
17	a condition to remaining in said institution and pursuing the		
18	course of study selected, excluding charges or fees including a		
19	reasonable allowance as established by the Secretary of the		
20	Department of Administration for books, supplies, tools,		
21 22	personal computers, and clothing . <u>specialty clothing required for</u>		
22	<u>the student's course of study.</u> <u>e.</u> <u>Travel allowance of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) per</u>		
23 24	e. <u>Travel allowance of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) per</u> semester.		
25	(2) With respect to private educational institutions, a scholarship shall		
26	consist of a monetary allowance as prescribed in G.S. 165-22.1(d).		
27	(3) Only one scholarship may be granted pursuant to this Article with		
28	respect to each child and it shall not extend for a longer period than		
29	four academic years, which years, however, need not be consecutive.		

1		However, an extension may be granted by the Secretary of the
2		Department of Administration for unusual or compelling situations.
3	(4)	No educational assistance shall be afforded a child under this Article
4		after the end of an eight-year period beginning on the date the
5		scholarship is first awarded. Those persons who have been granted a
6		scholarship under this Article prior to the effective date of this act shall
7		be entitled to the remainder of their period of scholarship eligibility if
8		used prior to August 1, 2010. Whenever a child is enrolled in an
9		educational institution and the period of entitlement ends while
10		enrolled in a term, quarter or semester, such period shall be extended
11		to the end of such term, quarter or semester, but not beyond the
12		entitlement limitation of four academic years."
13	SECT	FION 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 2008.
