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12 13 **SECTION 2.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Health and Human Services the sum of seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) for the 2007-2008 fiscal year to be used by the Division of Services for the Blind of the Department of Health and Human Services to establish an accessible electronic information service for blind and disabled persons in this State.

The Division shall establish, operate, promote, and administer a statewide accessible

electronic information service. The Director shall enter into an agreement with a

qualified entity to provide an accessible electronic information service for blind and

disabled persons. The Division shall plan for continuation of the service from year to

year and maximize use of federal and other funds available by obtaining grant or in-kind

support from appropriate programs and securing access to low-cost interstate rates for

SECTION 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 2007.
