1 The inspection fee for an emissions and safety inspection set out in this subsection is 2 the maximum amount that an inspection station or an inspection mechanic may charge 3 for an emissions and safety inspection of a vehicle. An inspection station or an 4 inspection mechanic may charge the maximum amount or any lesser amount for an 5 emissions and safety inspection of a vehicle. The inspection fee for a safety only 6 inspection set out in this subsection may not be increased or decreased. The sticker fees 7 set out in this subsection may not be increased or decreased.

8 (b) Self-Inspector. – The fee for an inspection does not apply to an inspection 9 performed by a self-inspector. The fee for putting an inspection sticker on issuing an 10 <u>electronic inspection authorization to a vehicle applies to an inspection performed by a</u> 11 self-inspector.

(Effective July 1, 2007) Fee Distribution. - Fees collected for inspection 12 (c) 13 stickers electronic inspection authorizations are payable to the Division of Motor 14 Vehicles. The amount of each fee listed in the table below shall be credited to the 15 Highway Fund, the Emissions Program Account established in subsection (d) of this 16 section, the Telecommunications Account established in subsection (d1) of this section, 17 the Volunteer Rescue/EMS Fund established in G.S. 58-87-5, the Rescue Squad 18 Workers' Relief Fund established in G.S. 58-88-5, and the Division of Air Quality of the 19 Department of Environment and Natural Resources: 20
