1	SECTION 2. G.S. 106-122(1) reads as rewritten:
2	"(1) The manufacture, sale, or delivery, holding or offering for sale of any
3	food, drug, device, or cosmetic that is adulterated or
4	misbranded.misbranded and the bottling, sale, or delivery of any water
5	that is adulterated or misbranded."
6	SECTION 3. G.S. 106-121(8) reads as rewritten:
7	"(8) The term "food" means means any of the following:
8	a. Articles used for food or drink for man or other animals.
9	including water that is bottled and offered for sale as a
10	<u>beverage.</u>
11	b. Chewing gum, and
12	c. Articles used for components of any such article."
13	SECTION 4. This act becomes effective October 1, 2007, and applies to
14	food items sold or offered for sale on or after that date.
