2	AN ACT TO REQUIRE ALL STATE AGENCIES TO RECYCLE ALL SPENT
3	FLUORESCENT LIGHTS AND MERCURY THERMOSTATS; REQUIRE THE
4	REMOVAL OF ALL FLUORESCENT LIGHTS AND MERCURY THERMOSTATS
5	FROM BUILDINGS PRIOR TO DEMOLITION; AND BAN MERCURY CONTAINING
6	PRODUCTS FROM UNLINED LANDFILLS.
7	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
8	SECTION 1. Article 9 of Chapter 130A of the General Statutes is amended by
9	adding a new Part to read:
10	"Part 7. Management of Certain Products That Contain Mercury.
11	" <u>§ 130A-310.60. Recycling required by State agencies.</u>
12	(a) Each State agency, including the General Assembly, the General Court of Justice,
13	universities, community colleges, and political subdivisions using State funds shall establish a
14	program in cooperation with the Department of Environment and Natural Resources and the
15	Department of Administration for the collection and recycling of all spent fluorescent lights
16	and thermostats that contain mercury generated in State offices. The program shall include
17	procedures for convenient collection, safe storage, and proper recycling of spent fluorescent
18	lights and thermostats that contain mercury and contractual or other arrangements with buyers
19	of the recyclable materials.
20	(b) The Department of Environment and Natural Resources and the Department of
21	Administration jointly shall submit a report to the Environmental Review Commission on or
22	before May 1, 2010, concerning the activities required under this section. The information
23	provided shall also be included in the report required by G.S. 130A-309.06(c).
24	"§ 130A-310.61. Removal and recycling of mercury containing products from structures
25	to be demolished.
26	Prior to demolition of any building or structure in the State, the contractor responsible for
27	the demolition activity or the owner of the building or structure to be demolished shall remove
28	all fluorescent lights and thermostats that contain mercury from the building or structure to be
29	demolished."
30	SECTION 2. G.S. 130A-309.10 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:
31	"(m) No person shall knowingly dispose of fluorescent lights and thermostats that contain
32	mercury in a sanitary landfill for the disposal of construction and demolition debris waste that
33	is unlined or in any other landfill that is unlined."

1 **SECTION 3.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2009, except that the recycling 2 program required by G.S. 130A-310.60, as enacted by Section 1 of this act, shall be established 3 and implemented by each State agency by December 1, 2009.
