Sponsors: Referred to: April 9, 2009 1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 2 AN ACT TO REQUIRE ALL PUBLIC AGENCIES TO RECYCLE ALL SPENT FLUORESCENT LIGHTS AND MERCURY THERMOSTATS; REQUIRE THE 3 4 REMOVAL OF ALL FLUORESCENT LIGHTS AND MERCURY THERMOSTATS 5 FROM BUILDINGS PRIOR TO DEMOLITION; AND BAN MERCURY-CONTAINING 6 PRODUCTS FROM UNLINED LANDFILLS. 7 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 8 SECTION 1. Article 9 of Chapter 130A of the General Statutes is amended by 9 adding a new Part to read: 10 "Part 7. Management of Certain Products That Contain Mercury. "§ 130A-310.60. Recycling required by public agencies. 11 Each State agency, including the General Assembly, the General Court of Justice, 12 (a) 13 universities, community colleges, public schools, and political subdivisions using State funds shall establish a program in cooperation with the Department of Environment and Natural 14 15 Resources and the Department of Administration for the collection and recycling of all spent fluorescent lights and thermostats that contain mercury generated in public buildings. The 16 17 program shall include procedures for convenient collection, safe storage, and proper recycling 18 of spent fluorescent lights and thermostats that contain mercury and contractual or other 19 arrangements with buyers of the recyclable materials. Each State agency, including the General Assembly, the General Court of Justice, 20 (b)21 universities, community colleges, the Department of Public Instruction on behalf of the public schools, and political subdivisions shall submit a report on or before February 1, 2010, that 22 23 documents the entity's compliance with the requirements of subsection (a) of this section to the 24 Department of Environment and Natural Resources and the Department of Administration. The Departments shall compile the information submitted and jointly shall submit a report to the 25 26 Environmental Review Commission on or before May 1, 2010, concerning the activities 27 required by subsection (a) of this section. The information provided shall also be included in the report required by G.S. 130A-309.06(c). 28 29 "§ 130A-310.61. Removal and recycling of mercury-containing products from structures to be demolished. 30 Prior to demolition of any building or structure in the State, the contractor responsible for 31 32 the demolition activity or the owner of the building or structure to be demolished shall remove 33 all fluorescent lights and thermostats that contain mercury from the building or structure to be demolished." 34

General Assembly Of North Carolina Session 2009 SECTION 2. G.S. 130A-309.10 is amended by adding a new subsection to read: 1 2 "(m) No person shall knowingly dispose of fluorescent lights and thermostats that contain 3 mercury in a sanitary landfill for the disposal of construction and demolition debris waste that 4 is unlined or in any other landfill that is unlined." SECTION 3. This act is effective when it becomes law, except that: (i) the 5 recycling program required by G.S. 130A-310.60, as enacted by Section 1 of this act, shall be 6 established and implemented by each State agency by December 1, 2009; (ii) G.S. 130A-7 8 310.61 as enacted by Section 1 of this act; and (iii) Section 2 of this act becomes effective 9 December 1, 2009, and applies to offenses committed on or after that date.
