(a)	It is unlawful:		
	(1) To take, possess, transport, sell, barter, trade, exchange, export, or offer for sale, barter, trade, exchange or export, or give away for any purpose		
	including advertising or other promotional purpose any animal on a		
	protected wild animal list, except as authorized according to the regulations		
	of the Commission, including those promulgated pursuant to		
	G.S. 113-333(1);G.S. 113-333(1).		
	(1a) To capture, injure, or kill a bat, disturb a bat in its roost, or deliberately		
	disturb a group of bats, or intentionally obstruct access to a bat roost;		
	however, nothing in this subdivision prevents a certified wildlife control		
	agent from engaging in bat exclusion actions otherwise authorized by the		
	Commission.		
	(2) To perform any act specifically prohibited by the regulations of the		
	Commission promulgated pursuant to its authority under G.S. 113-333.		
(b)	Each person convicted of violating the provisions of this Article is guilty of a Class		
1 misdem	eanor."
