The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

**SECTION 1.** G.S. 113-337 reads as rewritten:

## "§ 113-337. Unlawful acts; penalties.

(a) It is unlawful:

BATS.

- (1) To take, possess, transport, sell, barter, trade, exchange, export, or offer for sale, barter, trade, exchange or export, or give away for any purpose including advertising or other promotional purpose any animal on a protected wild animal list, except as authorized according to the regulations of the Commission, including those promulgated pursuant to G.S. 113-333(1); G.S. 113-333(1).
- (1a) To capture, injure, or kill a bat, disturb a bat in its roost, or deliberately disturb a group of bats, or intentionally obstruct access to a bat roost; however, nothing in this subdivision prevents a certified wildlife control agent from engaging in bat exclusion actions otherwise authorized by the Commission.
- (2) To perform any act specifically prohibited by the regulations of the Commission promulgated pursuant to its authority under G.S. 113-333.
- (b) Each person convicted of violating the provisions of this Article is guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor."

**SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective December 1, 2009, and applies to acts committed on or after that date.
