9	The General Assembly	v of North Carolina enacts:
10	SECTION	1. The Department of Environment and Natural Resources and the
11	Local Government Co	mmission of the Department of State Treasurer shall jointly evaluate the
12		requiring each public water system or wastewater system in the State to
13	demonstrate that the s	ystem raises sufficient revenue to cover the costs associated with proper
14	1 .	em, including the costs of maintenance, repair, and replacement of
15	collection, treatment, a	and distribution infrastructure.
16		Department of Environment and Natural Resources and the Local
17	Gov	vernment Commission shall specifically consider increasing their
18	ove	rsight role to include the following actions:
19	a.	Review grant applications submitted by a system to ensure that the
20		proposed grant match is funded from local revenues as opposed to
21		another grant.
22	b.	Develop benchmarks that a system must meet to ensure that the
23		system is operating in a financially sound manner.
24		Department of Environment and Natural Resources and the Local
25		vernment Commission shall specifically evaluate the desirability of
26		niring each public water system and wastewater system in the State to
27	cone	duct the following actions:
28	a.	Submit an annual audit statement to State water and wastewater
29		infrastructure funding agencies to which the system is applying for
30		loan or grant funds for the purpose of reporting on the operation of
31		the system and to demonstrate whether the water and wastewater
32		rates of each system are sufficient to maintain system operations and
33		meet debt service obligations.
34	b.	Implement remedial measures in the event that the audit statement
35		indicates a shortfall, including the submission of a written
36		explanation for the revenue shortfall from the governing body of the



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1	system and the development of a plan to ensure that system revenues
2	cover system costs.
3	c. Maintain a capital reserve fund.
4	d. Provide notification to funding agencies when a system is failing to
5	operate in compliance with applicable State and federal water quality
6	standards.
7	(3) The Department of Environment and Natural Resources and the Local
8	Government Commission shall identify and consider other actions or
9	measures that would improve the oversight of the financial condition of
10	public water systems and wastewater systems.
11	SECTION 2. For the purposes of this act, "public water system" has the same
12	meaning as in G.S. 130A-313(10) and "wastewater system" has the same meaning as in
13	G.S. 159G-20(25).
14	SECTION 3. The Department of Environment and Natural Resources and the
15	Local Government Commission shall jointly report their findings and recommendations to the
16	Legislative Study Commission on Water and Wastewater Infrastructure no later than November
17	1, 2010.
18	SECTION 4. This act is effective when it becomes law.
