8	SECTION 1	• G.S. 62-133.8(a)(5) reads as rewritten:
9	"(5) 'New	renewable energy facility' means a renewable energy facility that
10	either	satisfies any one or more of the following criteria:
11	a.	Was placed into service on or after January 1, 2007.
12	b.	Delivers or has delivered electric power to an electric power supplier
13		pursuant to a contract with NC GreenPower Corporation that was
14		entered into prior to January 1, 2007.
15	c.	Is a hydroelectric power facility with a generation capacity of 10
16		megawatts or less that delivers electric power to an electric power
17		supplier.
18	<u>d.</u>	Is a facility producing synthetic gas created by a plasma gasification
19		of biogenic material such as municipal solid waste, as defined in
20		G.S. 130A-290, or animal waste, as defined in G.S. 143-215.10B."

1 2 3 **SECTION 3.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the North Carolina Utilities Commission the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for the 2010-2011 fiscal year to be used to implement this act.

4 5 **SECTION 4.** Section 3 of this act becomes effective July 1, 2010. The remaining sections of this act are effective when the act becomes law.

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
