A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  AN ACT TO MAKE THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GREENSBORO SUBJECT TO THE STATE GOVERNMENT ETHICS ACT.  The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:  SECTION 1. G.S. 160A-86 reads as rewritten:  "§ 160A-86. Local governing boards' code of ethics.  (a) Governing boards of cities, counties, local boards of education, unified governments, sanitary districts, and consolidated city-counties shall adopt a resolution or policy containing a code of ethics to guide actions by the governing board members in the performance of the member's official duties as a member of that governing board.	
(b) The least all of the	he resolution or policy required by subsection (a) of this section shall address at e following:
(1	The need to obey all applicable laws regarding official actions taken as a board member.
(2	
(3	The need to avoid impropriety in the exercise of the board member's official duties.

(5	The need to conduct the affairs of the governing board in an open and public manner, including complying with all applicable laws governing open meetings and public records.
<u>(c)</u> <u>T</u>	he city council shall be treated as a board, as defined in G.S. 138A-3(1c) for
purposes of Chapter 138A of the General Statutes."	
<b>SECTION 2.</b> This act applies only to the City of Greensboro.	
<b>SECTION 3.</b> This act becomes effective July 1, 2010.
