A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO GIVE COMMUNITY COLLEGE BOARDS ADDITIONAL FLEXIBILITY IN SETTING THE SALARY OF COMMUNITY COLLEGE PRESIDENTS.

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

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SECTION 1. G.S. 115D-5(a) reads as rewritten:

6 "(a) The State Board of Community Colleges may adopt and execute such policies, 7 regulations and standards concerning the establishment, administration, and operation of 8 institutions as the State Board may deem necessary to insure the quality of educational 9 programs, to promote the systematic meeting of educational needs of the State, and to provide 10 for the equitable distribution of State and federal funds to the several institutions.

11 The State Board of Community Colleges shall establish standards and scales for salaries 12 and allotments paid from funds administered by the State Board, and all employees of the 13 institutions shall be exempt from the provisions of the State Personnel Act. Any and all salary caps set by the State Board for community college presidents shall apply only to State-paid 14 portion of the salary. The State Board shall have authority with respect to individual 15 institutions: to approve sites, capital improvement projects, budgets; to approve the selection of 16 17 the chief administrative officer; to establish and administer standards for professional personnel, curricula, admissions, and graduation; to regulate the awarding of degrees, diplomas, 18 19 and certificates; to establish and regulate student tuition and fees within policies for tuition and 20 fees established by the General Assembly; and to establish and regulate financial accounting 21 procedures.

The State Board of Community Colleges shall require all community colleges to meet the faculty credential requirements of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools for all community college programs."

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SECTION 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 2010.



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
