8	SECTION 1. G.S. 14-269.4 reads as rewritten:			
9		Weapons on State property and in courthouses.		
10	It shall be unlawful for any person to possess, or carry, whether openly or concealed, any			
11	deadly weapon, not used solely for instructional or officially sanctioned ceremonial purposes in			
12	the State Capitol Building, the Executive Mansion, the Western Residence of the Governor, or			
13	on the grounds of any of these buildings, and in any building housing any court of the General			
14		Court of Justice. If a court is housed in a building containing nonpublic uses in addition to the		
15	court, then this prohibition shall apply only to that portion of the building used for court			
16	purposes while the building is being used for court purposes.
