G.S. 7A-292 reads as rewritten: 6 "§ 7A-292. Additional powers of magistrates. 7 In addition to the jurisdiction and powers assigned in this Chapter to the magistrate in civil 8 and criminal actions, each magistrate has the following additional powers: 9 To administer oaths: (1)10 (2)To punish for direct criminal contempt subject to the limitations contained in Chapter 5A of the General Statutes of North Carolina; 11 When authorized by the chief district judge, to take depositions and 12 (3)examinations before trial; 13 14 To issue subpoenas and capiases valid throughout the county; (4) To take affidavits for the verification of pleadings; 15 (5) To issue writs of habeas corpus ad testificandum, as provided in G.S. 17-41; 16 (6) To assign a year's allowance to the surviving spouse and a child's allowance 17 (7)18 to the children as provided in Chapter 30, Article 4, of the General Statutes; To take acknowledgments of instruments, as provided in G.S. 47-1; 19 (8) 20 (9) To perform the marriage ceremony, as provided in G.S. 51-1; To take acknowledgment of a written contract or separation agreement 21 (10)22 between husband and wife; and Repealed by Session Laws 1973, c. 503, s. 9. 23 (11)To assess contribution for damages or for work done on a dam, canal, or 24 (12)25 ditch, as provided in G.S. 156-15. Repealed by Session Laws 1973, c. 503, s. 9. 26 (13)27 (14)To accept the filing of complaints and to issue summons pursuant to Article 4 of Chapter 42A of the General Statutes in expedited eviction proceedings 28 29 when the office of the clerk of superior court is closed. 30 (15)To provide for appointment of counsel pursuant to Article 36 of this Chapter." 31 32 **SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2009.
