6	SECTION 1. G.S. 20-63(h) reads as rewritten:			
7	"(h) Commission Contracts for Issuance of Plates and Certificates. – Al	l registration		
8	plates, registration certificates, and certificates of title issued by the Division, out			
9	issued from the Charlotte and Raleigh offices of the Division and those issued			
10	through the United States mail, shall be issued insofar as practicable and post			
11	commission contracts entered into by the Division for the issuance of the plates an			
12	in localities throughout North Carolina with persons, firms, corporations or g	governmental		
13	subdivisions of the State of North Carolina. The Division shall make a reasona	able effort in		
14	every locality, except as noted above, to enter into a commission contract for th	e issuance of		
15	the plates and certificates and a record of these efforts shall be maintained in the	Division. In		
16	the event the Division is unsuccessful in making commission contracts, it shall is

	SECTION 2. G.S. 20-63 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:		
	"(h3) All commission contractors and their designated employees shall be commissioned		
	as notaries public by the Secretary of State's office. If a commission contractor or the		
		ployee notarizes a document required to be notarized by law or by the Division,	
		ch notarial acts shall be those prescribed in G.S. 10B-31 for the first signature	
	and one dollar (\$1.00) for each additional signature, up to a total of seven dollars (\$7.00), and		
	shall be retained by the commission contractor as part of the consideration allowed pursuant to		
	the commission contract."
