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1	(a) The North Carolina Department of Environment and Natural Resources, the
2	Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation, and the Georgia Department of
3	Natural Resources shall provide staff support and facilities to the commission within the
4	existing programs of the respective agencies. Additional staff may be hired or contracted by the
5	commission through funds raised by or provided to it. The duties and compensation of any
6	additional staff shall be determined and fixed by the commission, within available resources.
7	(b) All agencies of the State of North Carolina, the State of Tennessee, and the State of
8	Georgia shall cooperate with the commission and, upon request, shall assist the commission in
9	fulfilling its responsibilities. The North Carolina Secretary of Environment and Natural
10	Resources, the Commissioner of the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation,
11	and the Commissioner of the Georgia Department of Natural Resources or their designees shall
12	each serve as the liaison between their respective state agencies and the commission.
13	(c) The commission may obtain information and data upon request from all state
14	officers, agents, agencies, and departments of the State of North Carolina, the State of
15	Tennessee, and the State of Georgia while in discharge of their duties.
16	" <u>§ 77-126. Funding.</u>
17	(a) The commission shall annually adopt a budget that shall include the estimated
18	income and expenses of the commission. Funding for the commission shall be shared and
19	apportioned between the State of North Carolina, the State of Tennessee, and the State of
20	Georgia as each state may provide through its regular appropriations process.
21	(b) The accounts and records of the commission showing the receipt and disbursement
22	of funds from whatever source derived shall be in the form that the Auditor of North Carolina,
23	the Tennessee Director of State Audit, and the Georgia State Auditor prescribe. The accounts
24	and records of the commission shall be subject to an annual audit by the Auditor of North
25 26	Carolina, the Tennessee Director of State Audit, and the Georgia State Auditor or their legal
20 27	representatives. The cost of the annual audits shall be borne by the commission. The results of the audits shall be delivered to the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations
28	of the General Assembly of North Carolina, the Tennessee General Assembly as the Tennessee
29	General Assembly shall provide, and to the Georgia General Assembly as the Georgia General
30	Assembly shall provide.
31	"§ 77-127. Compensation and expenses of commission members.
32	(a) Members of the commission who are appointed from or reside in North Carolina
33	shall receive no salary for their service on the commission but may be paid, within available
34	resources, per diem, subsistence, and travel expenses as follows:
35	(1) Members of the commission who are members of the General Assembly at
36	the rate established in G.S. 120-3.1.
37	(2) Members of the commission who are officials or employees of the State or
38	of local government agencies at the rate established in G.S. 138-6.
39	(3) All other members of the commission at the rate established in G.S. 138-5.
40	(b) Members of the commission who are appointed from or reside in Tennessee shall be
41	compensated as provided by the Tennessee General Assembly.
42	(c) Members of the commission who are appointed from or reside in Georgia shall be
43	compensated as provided by the Georgia General Assembly.
44	(d) All expenses shall be paid from funds appropriated or otherwise available to the
45	commission.
46	" <u>§ 77-128. Annual report.</u>
47	The commission shall submit an annual report, including any recommendations, on or
48	before October 1 of each year to the Governor of North Carolina and the Environmental
49	Review Commission of the General Assembly of North Carolina; the Governor of Tennessee
50	and the Tennessee General Assembly, as the Governor, the General Assembly of Tennessee, or
51	the Commissioner of the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation shall

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1	provide; and to the Governor of Georgia and the Georgia General Assembly, as the Governor,
2	the General Assembly of Georgia, or the Conservation Commissioner of the Georgia
3	Department of Natural Resources shall provide.
4	" <u>§ 77-129. Termination.</u>
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina may terminate the commission by repealing this
6	Part. The commission shall terminate if the Tennessee General Assembly and the Georgia
7	General Assembly both repeal the provisions of the Tennessee Annotated Code and the Official
8	Code of Georgia Annotated that are comparable to this Part."
9	SECTION 6. The Little Tennessee River Basin Advisory Commission shall submit
10	the first report pursuant to G.S. 77-128, as enacted by Section 5 of this act, on or before
11	October 1, 2011.
12	SECTION 7. This act shall not be construed to obligate the General Assembly of
13	North Carolina, the Tennessee General Assembly, or the Georgia General Assembly to
14	appropriate any funds to implement the provisions of this act.
15	SECTION 8. This act is effective when it becomes law.
