5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:	
6	SECTION 1. The North Carolina Department of Correction and the North Carolina	
7	Department of Justice shall study all of the following:	
8	(1)	Issues that impede the timely certification of correctional officers and
9		probation/parole officers and ways to expedite the certification process.
10	(2)	The current minimum education and training requirements for correctional
11		and probation/parole officers and whether those requirements are necessary
12		and appropriate for certified employees of the Department of Correction.
13	(3)	Inconsistencies between rules promulgated by the North Carolina Criminal
14		Justice Education and Training Standards Commission and applicable State
15		and federal laws, and ways to resolve those inconsistencies.
16	(4)	The current process of certifying criminal justice training schools and
17		programs or courses of instruction and whether that process could be
18		expedited.
19	(5)	Ways to improve communication and cooperation between the Criminal
20		Justice Standards Division and the Department of Correction regarding the
21		employment, education, training, and retention of correctional officers and
22		probation/parole officers.
23	(6)	Ways to expedite and enhance the technical assistance the Criminal Justice
24		Standards Division provides to the Department of Correction pursuant to
25		Chapter 17C of the General Statutes.
26	(7)	The feasibility and advisability of establishing a separate training and
27		standards commission for State correctional officers and probation/parole
28		officers.
29		FION 2. The Department of Correction and the Department of Justice shall
30	report their findings and recommendations no later than April 1, 2010, to the Chairs of the	
31	House of Representatives and Senate Appropriations Subcommittees on Justice and Public	
32	Safety and the Joint Legislative Corrections, Crime Control, and Juvenile Justice Oversight	
33	Committee.	
34	SEC	FION 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 2009.



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
