8	(a)	Defini	itions. – For purposes of this section, the following terms shall mean:
9		(1)	Additional technology. – As defined in G.S. 20-137.3(a)(1).
10		(2)	Emergency situation Circumstances such as medical concerns, unsafe
11			road conditions, matters of public safety, or mechanical problems that create
12			a risk of harm for the operator or passengers of a school bus.
13		(3)	Mobile telephone. – As defined in G.S. 20-137.3(a)(2).
14		(4)	School bus As defined in G.S. 20-4.01(27)d4. The term also includes any
15			school activity bus as defined in G.S. 20-4.01(27)d3. and any vehicle
16			transporting public, private, or parochial school students for compensation.
17		<u>(5)</u>	Wireless telephone service. – As defined in G.S. 20-137.3(a)(3).

29		<u>(1)</u>	The use of a mobile telephone for the sole purpose of communicating with
30			any of the following regarding an emergency situation: an emergency
31			response operator; a hospital, physician's office, or health clinic; a public or
32			privately owned ambulance company or service; a fire department; or a law
33			enforcement agency.
34		<u>(2)</u>	Any of the following while in the performance of their official duties: a law
35			enforcement officer; a member of a fire department; or the operator of a
36			public or private ambulance.



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1	(3) The use of a hands-free mobile telephone to make a call only and not for the
2	purpose of accessing additional technology.
3	(e) Local Ordinances. – No local government may pass any ordinance regulating the
4	use of mobile telephones or additional technology associated with a mobile telephone by
5	operators of school buses.technology.
6	(f) Penalty. – A violation of this section by a person driving a school bus shall be a
7	Class 2 misdemeanor and shall be punishable by a fine of not less than one hundred dollars
8	(\$100.00). A violation of this section by any other driver who is 18 years old or older and not
9	subject to the provisions of G.S. 20-137.3 shall be an infraction and shall be punishable by a
10	fine of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) and the cost of court. No drivers license points or
11	insurance surcharge shall be assessed as a result of a violation of this section. Failure to comply
12	with the provisions of this section shall not constitute negligence per se or contributory
13	negligence by the operator in any action for the recovery of damages arising out of the
14	operation, ownership, or maintenance of a school bus.motor vehicle."
15	SECTION 2. This act becomes effective December 1, 2009, and applies to
16	offenses committed on or after that date.
