A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 2 AN ACT TO PERMIT HOME SCHOOL, CHARTER SCHOOL, AND PRIVATE SCHOOL 3 STUDENTS TO PARTICIPATE IN INTERSCHOLASTIC ATHLETICS AND TO 4 APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR THAT PURPOSE. 5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 6 **SECTION 1.** G.S. 115C-12(23) reads as rewritten: 7 "§ 115C-12. Powers and duties of the Board generally. 8 The general supervision and administration of the free public school system shall be vested 9 in the State Board of Education. The State Board of Education shall establish policy for the system of free public schools, subject to laws enacted by the General Assembly. The powers 10 11 and duties of the State Board of Education are defined as follows: 12 13 Power to Adopt Eligibility Rules for Interscholastic Athletic Competition. -(23)14 The State Board of Education may adopt rules governing interscholastic athletic activities conducted by local boards of education, including 15 16 eligibility for student participation. Students attending home schools or other 17 nonpublic schools shall be permitted to participate in interscholastic athletic activities in accordance with the requirements of G.S. 115C-566.1; students 18 attending charter schools shall be permitted to participate in interscholastic 19 20 athletic activities in accordance with the requirements of G.S. 115C-238.29L. The State Board of Education may authorize a 21 22 designated organization to apply and enforce the Board's rules governing 23 participation in interscholastic athletic activities at the high school level." 24 **SECTION 2.** G.S. 115C-47(4) reads as rewritten: 25 "§ 115C-47. Powers and duties generally. In addition to the powers and duties designated in G.S. 115C-36, local boards of education 26 27 shall have the power or duty: 28 To Regulate Extracurricular Activities. - Local boards of education shall 29 (4)

29(4)To Regulate Extracurricular Activities. - Local boards of education shall30make all rules and regulations necessary for the conducting of31extracurricular activities in the schools under their supervision, including a32program of athletics, where desired, without assuming liability therefore;33provided, that all interscholastic athletic activities shall be conducted in34accordance with rules and regulations prescribed by the State Board of35Education. 11	participation required of enrolled non-charter public school students and shall be required to
12	purchase any supplemental insurance required of enrolled non-charter public school students or
13	as reasonably established for participation of charter school students."
14	SECTION 5. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of
15	Public Instruction the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for the 2010-2011 fiscal
16	year. The Department shall use these funds to assist local boards of education in complying
17	with the provisions of this act.
18	SECTION 6. Section 5 of this act becomes effective July 1, 2010. The remainder
19	of this act is effective when it becomes law and applies beginning with the 2010-2011 school
20	year.
