A SENATE RESOLUTION TO ESTABLISH THE PROCEDURE FOR NOMINATING AND ELECTING MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA.

4 Be it resolved by the Senate:

5 **SECTION 1.** The following procedures for nominating and electing members of 6 the Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina are adopted:

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I. COMMITTEE RESPONSIBILITIES.

8 1. It is the duty of the Senate Committee on Education/Higher Education 9 (hereinafter referred to as the "Senate Committee") to choose nominees for each opening on the 10 Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina to which the Senate is to elect 11 members.

12 2. The Senate Committee shall receive suggestions of proposed candidates for nomination for election to the Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina from 13 Monday, March 2, 2009, through Friday, March 6, 2009. In 2009, the total number of positions 14 15 available for election by the Senate is eight, and each position is for a four-year term. A Senator 16 may propose candidates for nomination only for the openings available for election by the 17 Senate. In order for a person to have standing to be considered as a candidate for nomination by the Senate Committee, that person must be formally nominated as a candidate by a member of 18 the Senate. Only a written nomination on a form provided by the Cochairs of the Senate 19 20 Committee for that purpose and received in the Office of the Senate Principal Clerk on or after Monday, March 2, 2009, and no later than 5:00 P.M. on Friday, March 6, 2009, shall constitute 21 22 a formal nomination of a candidate. Delivery to the Office of the Senate Principal Clerk of a 23 nomination form by facsimile transmission or e-mail transmission shall not constitute a formal 24 nomination of a candidate. An individual is not eligible for nomination in the Senate if he or 25 she was nominated and not elected to the Board of Governors by the House of Representatives 26 during the 2009 Session.

3. Notwithstanding G.S. 138A-22, every person who has been formally nominated
shall file a completed North Carolina State Ethics Commission Statement of Economic Interest
with the North Carolina State Ethics Commission to be received by the North Carolina State
Ethics Commission no later than 5:00 P.M. on Friday, March 6, 2009.

31 4. On or after March 7, 2009, the Senate Committee shall list all proposed 32 candidates for nomination. The Senate Committee shall screen the proposed candidates for 33 nomination as to their qualifications and background and may interview each one to make sure 34 that suitable persons are nominated. The Senate Committee shall ascertain that each candidate 35 for nomination is willing and able to serve and has no statutory disability. On completion of the



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1	screening process, the Senate Committee shall conduct a vote to ensure that the slate of legally			
2	qualified candidates lists no more than twice the number of candidates for the			
3	5. The Cochairs of the Senate Committee shall ascertain whether the nominees for			
4	election by the Senate would serve if elected. Any nominee may withdraw	without the approval		
5	of the sponsor.			
6	6. Senate Committee nominees shall be placed before and recommended to the			
7	Senate for election.			
8	II. ELECTIONS IN THE SENATE.			
9	1. A ballot shall be prepared under the supervision of the Cochairs of the Senate			
10 11	Committee for the use of the Senate.			
11	2. The ballot shall list only the names of those nominees proposed by the Senate Committee who have consented to run and for whom the Senate is entitled to vote. Their names			
12	shall be arranged alphabetically by surname.			
13 14	3. The Senate shall hold its election no later than the beginning	of the daily session		
14	on March 31, 2009. Before the voting begins, the Cochairs of the Sena	•
