## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2 AN ACT TO ENACT THE SCHOOL VIOLENCE PREVENTION ACT AND TO DEFINE 3 BULLYING OR HARASSING BEHAVIOR AS USED IN THE ACT AS ANY 4 ELECTRONIC, PATTERN OF GESTURES OR WRITTEN, OR VERBAL 5 COMMUNICATIONS, OR ANY PHYSICAL ACT OR ANY THREATENING 6 COMMUNICATION, THAT TAKES PLACE ON SCHOOL PROPERTY, AT ANY 7 SCHOOL-SPONSORED FUNCTION, OR ON A SCHOOL BUS, AND THAT PLACES 8 A STUDENT OR SCHOOL EMPLOYEE IN ACTUAL AND REASONABLE FEAR OF 9 HARM TO HIS OR HER PERSON OR DAMAGE TO HIS OR HER PROPERTY; OR 10 CREATES OR IS CERTAIN TO CREATE A HOSTILE ENVIRONMENT BY 11 SUBSTANTIALLY INTERFERING WITH OR IMPAIRING Α STUDENT'S 12 EDUCATIONAL PERFORMANCE, OPPORTUNITIES, OR BENEFITS; TO DEFINE 13 HOSTILE ENVIRONMENT AS USED IN THE ACT AS MEANING THE VICTIM 14 SUBJECTIVELY VIEWS THE CONDUCT AS BULLYING OR HARASSING 15 BEHAVIOR AND THE CONDUCT IS OBJECTIVELY SEVERE OR PERVASIVE 16 ENOUGH THAT A REASONABLE PERSON WOULD AGREE THAT IT IS 17 BULLYING OR HARASSING BEHAVIOR; TO PROVIDE THAT BULLYING OR 18 HARASSING BEHAVIOR INCLUDES, BUT IS NOT LIMITED TO, ACTS REASONABLY PERCEIVED AS BEING MOTIVATED BY ANY ACTUAL OR 19 20 PERCEIVED DIFFERENTIATING CHARACTERISTIC, SUCH AS RACE, COLOR, 21 RELIGION, ANCESTRY, NATIONAL ORIGIN, GENDER, SOCIOECONOMIC 22 STATUS, ACADEMIC STATUS, GENDER IDENTITY, PHYSICAL APPEARANCE, 23 SEXUAL ORIENTATION, OR MENTAL, PHYSICAL, DEVELOPMENTAL, OR 24 SENSORY DISABILITY. OR BY ASSOCIATION WITH A PERSON WHO HAS OR IS 25 PERCEIVED TO HAVE ONE OR MORE OF THESE CHARACTERISTICS; AND TO 26 REOUIRE ALL LOCAL SCHOOL ADMINISTRATIVE UNITS TO ADOPT A POLICY 27 PROHIBITING BULLYING AND HARASSING BEHAVIOR AS REQUIRED BY THE 28 ACT.

Whereas, the General Assembly of North Carolina finds that a safe and civil environment in school is necessary in order for students to learn and achieve high academic standards; and

Whereas, bullying and harassment, like other disruptive or violent behaviors, is conduct that disrupts both a student's ability to learn and a school's ability to educate its students in a safe environment; and

Whereas, bullying and harassing behaviors create a climate that fosters violence in our schools; and
