1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 2 AN ACT TO REMOVE HAZARDOUS TITLE V SOURCES OF AIR POLLUTION FROM 3 STATE REGULATION, WHICH APPLIES HEALTH-BASED AIR QUALITY 4 STANDARDS, TO THE END THAT THESE HAZARDOUS TITLE V SOURCES WILL 5 BE SUBJECT TO REGULATION UNDER ONLY THE FEDERAL CLEAN AIR ACT. 6 WHICH **APPLIES** MAXIMUM ACHIEVABLE CONTROL **TECHNOLOGY** 7 STANDARDS. 8 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 9 **SECTION 1.** G.S. 143-215.107(a) reads as rewritten: 10 Duty to Adopt Plans, Standards, etc. - The Commission is hereby directed and empowered, as rapidly as possible within the limits of funds and facilities available to it, and 11 12 subject to the procedural requirements of this Article and Article 21: 13 14 (5) To develop and adopt emission control standards as in the judgment of the Commission may be necessary to prohibit, abate, or control air pollution 15 16 commensurate with established air quality standards. This subdivision does not apply to that portion of the National Emission Standards for Hazardous 17 18 Air Pollutants for asbestos that governs demolition and renovation as set out 19 in 40 C.F.R. § 61.141, 61.145, 61.150, and 61.154 (1 July 1993 edition).any 20 air emission source subject to hazardous air pollutant emission standards 21 under 40 C.F.R. Pts. 61 and 63. 22

**SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2009.

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
