4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	SECTION 1. G.S. 143-746(a) reads as rewritten:
6	"§ 143-746. Internal auditing required.
7	(a) Requirements. – A State agency shall establish a program of internal auditing that:
8	(1) Implements an effective system of internal controls that safeguards public
9	funds and assets and minimizes incidences of fraud, waste, and abuse.
10	(2) Ensures programs and business operations are administered in compliance
11	with federal and state laws, regulations, and other requirements.
12	(3) Reviews the effectiveness and efficiency of agency and program operations
13	and service delivery. <u>delivery, in consultation with the Office of</u>
14	Management Innovation.
15	(4) Periodically audits the agency's major systems and controls, including:
16	a. Accounting systems and controls.
17	b. Administrative systems and controls.
18	c. Electronic data processing systems and controls."
19 20	SECTION 2. Chapter 147 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new Article to read:

23	"§ 147-33.120. Office of Management Innovation established.
24	The North Carolina Office of Management Innovation (Office) is established within the
25	Office of State Budget and Management to provide training and support for State agencies to
26	implement best practices in management in order to give agencies the tools necessary to
27	improve efficiency and economy.
28	" <u>§ 147-33.121. Duties.</u>
29	The Office shall have the following duties:
30	(1) Train State agencies to identify ways to improve the effectiveness,
31	efficiency, and quality of agency and program operations and services.
32	(2) Train and assist State agencies to adopt a systems approach to management.
33	This may include, but is not limited to, adopting elements of the following
34	management systems:

4	SECTION 3. Part 2 of Article 1 of Chapter 116 of the General Statutes is amended
5	by adding a new section to read:
6	" <u>§ 116-34.2. Institute of Management Innovation established.</u>
7	The Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina shall establish the Institute of
8	Management Innovation within the Department of Political Science and Public Affairs at
9	Western Carolina University to conduct research regarding best practices in management and
10	act as a resource for the North Carolina Office of Management Innovation, established in
11	Article 3E of Chapter 147 of the General Statutes."
12	SECTION 4. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Office of State
13	Budget and Management the sum of one million sixty-eight thousand dollars (\$1,068,000) for
14	the 2009-2010 fiscal year and the sum of one million sixty-eight thousand dollars (\$1,068,000)
15	for the 2010-2011 fiscal year for the support of the Office of Management Innovation. There is
16	appropriated from the General Fund to The University of North Carolina the sum of two
17	hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) for the 2009-2010 fiscal year and the sum of two
18	hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) for the 2010-2011 fiscal year for the support of the
19	Institute of Management Innovation at Western Carolina University.
20	SECTION 5. This act becomes effective July 1, 2009.
