7	The holder of any commercial permit issued under G.S. 18B-1100, a distiller broker						
8	representative pe	representative permit, or a distiller representative permit may conduct a consumer tasting event

10	<u>(1)</u>	Each consumer is limited to tasting samples which total no more than 1.5					
11		ounces of spirituous liquor in any calendar day.					
12	<u>(2)</u>	The consumer shall not be charged for any spirituous liquor tasting sample.					
13	<u>(3)</u>	The spirituous liquor used in the consumer tasting event shall be purchased					
14		at the regular sales price from the ABC store where the event is being held					
15		by the permit holder conducting the event.					
16	<u>(4)</u>	A consumer tasting event shall not be allowed when the sale of spirituous					
17		liquor is otherwise prohibited on the premises where the tasting is to be					
18		conducted.					
19	<u>(5)</u>	Tasting samples are not to be offered to, or allowed to be consumed by, any					
20		person under the legal age for consuming spirituous liquor.					
21	<u>(6)</u>	Point-of-sale advertising materials and advertising specialties may be					
22		furnished for use at the event by the permit holder conducting the event.					
23	<u>(7)</u>	A consumer tasting event may be advertised by the permit holder in any type					
24		of media, including, but not limited to, print, radio, television, Internet, and					
25		signage and these advertisements may include the date, time, location, and					
26		other information regarding the event."
